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## India, Cyprus agree to deepen ties in defence industry, Connectivity

New Delhi, May 22 (GNS): Cyprus President Nikos Christodoulides and Prime Minister Narendra Modi, at their meeting held here on Friday, agreed to elevate the relations between the two countries to a strategic level with deeper cooperation in defence and transport connectivity, according to senior government officials.

Noting that Prime Minister Modi visited Cyprus last year, the officials said that the "traditionally excellent relations" have now been elevated to a strategic level. "Over the past year, we have seen several important developments in our bilateral relations," an official said.

"Cyprus is interested in strengthening cooperation with the Indian defence industry and also wants the defence industries



of the two countries to work together. President Nikos Christodoulides is reported to have highlighted that the European Union is investing more than 150 billion euros through the SAFE instrument to enhance defence and security across the EU and its member states. Cyprus is eligible for

1.2 billion euros, and is interested in enhancing its military capabilities and exploring the possibility of procuring from India," an official said. The two sides agreed that the Defence Minister will visit soon to discuss defence cooperation and specific products of interest, the official said. In

order to enhance transport connectivity, the relevant Transport Minister will hold meetings with Air India and IndiGo regarding the possibility of starting direct flights. There is interest from both companies, and the direct connectivity is expected to be established by the end of the year.

Indian companies have already invested in Cyprus and have full access to the European market in a number of sectors, including defence, manufacturing, and technology. Cyprus serves as an important gateway to Europe.

In Mumbai, there is already strong business cooperation between the companies of the two countries across various sectors, and there is potential for further expansion. Cyprus has decided to open a trade office in Mum-

bai from September 1 this year. It will be sending additional high-level diplomats to its mission in New Delhi. The shooting of the first Bollywood film in Cyprus has been announced. Filming of the romantic story will begin this June, and the film is expected to be released on 14 February next year. In Mumbai, Eurobank has also opened its first representative office. It is important that this bank is working on integrating systems, including UPI, which will be operational in Cyprus next year. This will enable users in Cyprus to use the system, and in the future, it will also support non-Indian users, including those investing between the two countries.

The Cyprus presidency began with the announcement of a Free Trade Agreement in January.

## India delivers 20 tonnes of critical vaccine



Kabul/New Delhi: Continuing with its humanitarian support for Afghanistan, India on Friday delivered 20 tonnes of Bacillus Calmette-Guerin (BCG) and Tetanus & Diphtheria (Td) vaccines to Kabul to boost immunisation efforts among Afghan children.

Taking to X, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) spokesperson, Randhir Jaiswal said, "India delivers 20 tonnes of critical dry materials for BCG and Tetanus & Diphtheria (Td) vaccines to Kabul, to augment Afghanistan's Child Immunisation Programme. More consignments are underway. India is committed to support the friendly people of Afghanistan in the health sector. Earlier in April, India delivered 13 tonnes of BCG vaccines and related dry material to support Afghanistan's child immunisation programme to fight Tuberculosis (TB).

In a post on X, Jaiswal stated, "India delivers 13 tonnes of BCG vaccines

and related dry material to Afghanistan's Ministry of Public Health to augment Afghanistan's child immunisation programme against tuberculosis."

On April 5, India sent Humanitarian Assistance and Disaster Relief material (HADR) to Afghanistan due to the problems faced by people after recent floods and earthquakes.

India expressed its solidarity with the people of Afghanistan and commitment to extending humanitarian assistance during this challenging time. "At this time of hardship being faced by the Afghan people due to recent floods and earthquakes, India delivers HADR materials, including kitchen sets, hygiene kits, plastic sheets, tarpaulins, sleeping bags, and more. India stands in solidarity with the people of Afghanistan and remains committed to extending humanitarian assistance and support during this challenging time," the MEA posted on X.

## Punjab local body polls to be held using ballot papers

Chandigarh, May 22 (GNS) Local body elections in Punjab will be held using ballot papers with the high court here on Friday, May 22, dismissing petitions seeking polling by EVMs, observing that the petitioners had approached the court quite late and elections were barely days away.

Polling for 104 municipal bodies including eight municipal corporations in Punjab will be held on May 26. The counting of votes will take place on May 29.

The PILs before the Punjab and Haryana High Court had challenged the Punjab State Election Commission's decision of holding the elections for municipal corporations, municipal councils and nagar panchayats through ballot papers.

Punjab's Additional Advocate General Ferry Sofat told reporters on Friday, "Three petitions were filed that elections should be held through EVMs. State Election Commission had maintained that even after EVMs, which were stated to be in transit by the Election Commission.

"India, today, offered a unique combination of scale, technology and talent and growth opportunities. The ecosystem being developed at GIFT City was strengthening the country's

position in global finance and investment," she said.

The Finance Minister also underlined the need for futuristic policy discussions to result in immediate implementation and measurable changes on the ground.

## Ebola risk upgraded to 'very high' in congo: WHO Chief

Addis Ababa, May 22 (GNS): The public health risk from the Ebola outbreak in the Democratic Republic of Congo has been upgraded from high to very high, the World Health Organization (WHO) said on Friday. "We are revising our risk assessment of Ebola to very high at the national level, high at the regional level, and low at global level," WHO chief Tedros Adhanom Ghebreyesus told a press conference.

Meanwhile, the Africa Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (Africa CDC) called for enhanced solidarity to rapidly contain the latest Ebola outbreak in the Demo-



cratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) and Uganda, Xinhua News Agency reported. In a statement released on Thursday, the African Union's specialised healthcare agency

stressed that containing outbreaks "requires speed, coordination, and sustained support for the frontline responders and communities bearing the greatest burden." The agency further announced that it has committed an immediate financial support of 1 million U.S. dollars to strengthen emergency operations and deployed an eight-member multidisciplinary team to Bunia in the DRC's Ituri Province.

Urging for robust African solidarity in action, the agency welcomed South Africa's contribution of 2.5 million US dollars to support Ebola response efforts. It also recognized the dedication of

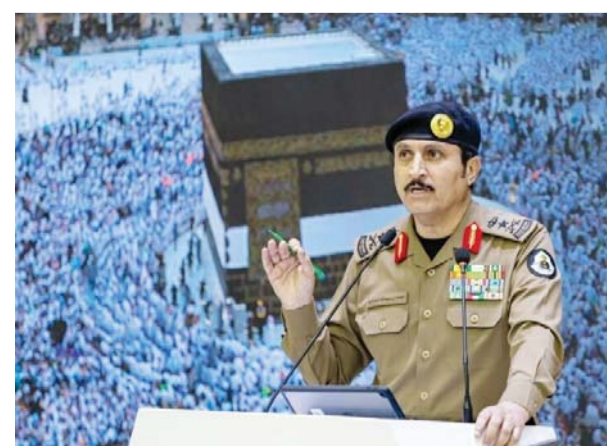
frontline health workers for their "commitment to ending the outbreak and protecting communities." Meanwhile, the agency announced that, at the request of the Ugandan government, it is convening a high-level cross-border coordination meeting from Friday to Saturday, bringing together Uganda, the DRC, and South Sudan to strengthen regional preparedness and response.

According to the figures released Thursday by DRC Health Minister Roger Kamba, 626 suspected cases and 159 probable deaths have been recorded since the country declared its 17th outbreak on May 15.

## Saudi Arabia says Hajj will not be exploited as over 1.5 million pilgrims arrive

MAKKAH, MAY 22 (UND) — Saudi Arabia stressed on Friday that it will not allow the Hajj season to be exploited for any activities that violate its religious purpose, as authorities announced the arrival of more than 1.5 million pilgrims from abroad and revealed the dismantling of hundreds of fake Hajj campaigns across the Kingdom.

The remarks came during a press conference held by Hajj security commanders at the Unified Security Operations Center (911) in Makkah, where officials reviewed security, traffic and



organizational plans for the 1447H Hajj season. Director of Public Security and Chairman of the Hajj Security Committee Lieutenant Gen-

eral Mohammed Al-Bassami confirmed the full readiness of the Hajj security system to carry out its duties during the pilgrimage season.

"Our goal is for the pilgrim to reach his destination, perform his rituals and return safely to his homeland," Al-Bassami said, calling on pilgrims to focus solely on worship. He explained that crowd management plans focus on organizing movement flows, distributing crowd density and reducing route overlap as much as possible, while advanced technologies work alongside security personnel to enforce Hajj regulations and detect fake campaigns and violators.

Al-Bassami revealed that authorities had dismantled

more than 217 fake Hajj campaigns nationwide and turned back 7733 violators of residency, labor and border security laws who attempted to enter Makkah illegally. Authorities also denied entry to 366,000 unauthorized individuals at Makkah entry points and intercepted thousands of unauthorized vehicles used to transport violators. He said field indicators showed a significant improvement in compliance compared with last year, including a 44% drop in the number of violators and deportees.

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# Amit Shah Urges States to Cut Dropout Rates, Fast-Track Criminal Case Disposal by 2029

JAGDALPUR, May 22 (UNI): Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday said High Courts should set up special courts for the speedy disposal of cases pending for more than five years.

Chairing the 26th meeting of the Central Zonal Council (CZC) in Jagdalpur, headquarters of Chhattisgarh's Bastar district, Shah also said timely DNA testing in cases registered under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act and rape cases could raise conviction rates in these offences to "100 per cent". The meeting was attended by Chhattisgarh Chief Minister Vishnu Deo Sai, Madhya Pradesh Chief Minister Mohan Yadav, Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister

Yogi Adityanath and Uttarakhand Chief Minister Pushkar Singh Dhami along with senior officials, said an official release.

Shah said it was a matter of "great joy" that the meeting was being held in Bastar after achieving the "historic milestone" of a Naxal-free India. The entire credit for making India Naxal-free goes to the hard work and bravery of the jawans of our security forces, he said, adding that coordinated efforts by intelligence agencies, state police and Central Armed Police Forces (CAPFs) ensured timely and decisive action against Naxalites. He said development initiatives were simultaneously carried out in areas freed from

Naxalism under the "Whole of Government Approach", with state governments and central departments working together. "Our fight is not over yet because Naxal-affected areas have been lagging behind in the race for development for nearly five decades. The effort would continue until these regions matched the rest of the country in terms of development," the release quoted Shah as saying. After resolving all contentious issues between the states (in the central zonal council) as well as those between the states and the Centre, the meeting was being held in a very positive and cordial atmosphere, he said.

The meeting focused mainly on monitoring de-



velopment works, including Jal Jeevan Mission-2, nutrition, health, education, financial inclusion and power sector reforms.

Union Home Minister said that if timely DNA test-

ing is conducted in POCSO and rape cases, the conviction rate in these cases can increase to 100 per cent.

The High Courts should establish special courts for the speedy disposal of cases

pending in courts for more than five years, Shah said, adding that the administration must demonstrate seriousness in dealing with serious crimes.

He also called upon all the chief ministers and chief secretaries to join hands and move forward shoulder to shoulder with the Government of India in the fight against malnutrition.

The Union minister also stressed the need to reduce school dropout rates and improve the quality of education. Ensuring banking facilities within a five-kilometre radius was a major achievement as most welfare schemes are linked to Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT), he said. Shah also urged states to implement their 1930 cy-

bercrime helplines in line with the Union Home Ministry's model format, and modernise their call centres. On food adulteration cases, he said penalties imposed on guilty establishments should be widely publicised to create public awareness. Referring to the implementation of the new criminal laws, Shah said the three "Naveen Nyaya Sanhitas" had been implemented effectively but further emphasis was needed on certain aspects. The government should aim to ensure disposal of every criminal case, including those reaching the Supreme Court, within three years before 2029, he said.

Highlighting the functioning of Zonal Councils, Shah said India's federal structure

had become stronger under Prime Minister Narendra Modi's leadership, and regular council meetings had helped resolve disputes among states and between states and the Centre.

Only 11 Zonal Council meetings were held between 2004 and 2014, compared to 32 meetings between 2014 and 2026, he said while also pointing out that Standing Committee meetings increased from 14 to 35 during the same period. Between 2004 and 2014, discussions were held on just 569 issues at these meetings, whereas from 2014 to 2026, discussions have taken place on 1,729 issues, out of which nearly 80 per cent have also been resolved, he said.

## Technical Sessions Focus on Fisheries, Seaweed Farming and Digital Platforms

New Delhi, May 22 (UNI): Guided by Hon'ble Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi's vision of "Sahkar Se Samridhhi", which is being implemented across the country under the leadership of Hon'ble Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation Shri Amit Shah, a National Level Workshop on Fisheries Cooperative Societies was organised in Hyderabad on 15th May, 2026. The workshop formed part of a continuing series of regional and national cooperative consultations being organised across different parts of the country to strengthen the fisheries cooperative ecosystem and promote "Cooperation



among Cooperatives" for inclusive and sustainable growth of fisherfolk communities and rural economies. Earlier workshops under the same initiative were organised in Mizoram and Jaipur. The National Workshop brought together senior officials from various State

Governments, representatives of fisheries institutions, cooperative organisations, financial institutions and development agencies. Senior officers from the Department of Fisheries, Government of India, also participated virtually in the deliberations. The National Fisheries Development Board (NFDB) actively participated in the workshop process and technical discussions. The deliberations focused on strengthening inter-state coordination, accelerating implementation of fisheries-related schemes at the grassroots level and evolving institutional mechanisms for regular monitoring, issue resolution and

policy feedback.

Addressing the inaugural session, Secretary, Ministry of Cooperation, Government of India, Dr. Ashish Kumar Bhutani underlined the growing importance of fisheries cooperative societies in strengthening rural livelihoods, increasing income opportunities and building sustainable community-led economic systems. He stated that cooperative institutions have emerged as an effective framework for ensuring inclusive development, particularly for fishermen, women and rural families associated with the fisheries value chain. He further emphasised the need to strengthen institutional mechanisms.

## SC declines spiceJet relief but allows airline to move delhi HC again

New Delhi: The Supreme Court on Tuesday allowed beleaguered low-cost airline SpiceJet and its Chairman Ajay Singh to approach the Delhi High Court for modification of a direction requiring a cash deposit of Rs. 144.51 crore in its long-running arbitration dispute with Kalanithi Maran and Kal Airways Private Limited.

A bench of Justices P.S. Narasimha and Alok Aradhya disposed of the special leave petition (SLP) filed by SpiceJet and Ajay Singh, permitting them to approach the Delhi High Court afresh in light of recent developments arising from the West Asia crisis



and the Centre's Emergency Credit Line Guarantee Scheme (ECLGS) 5.0.

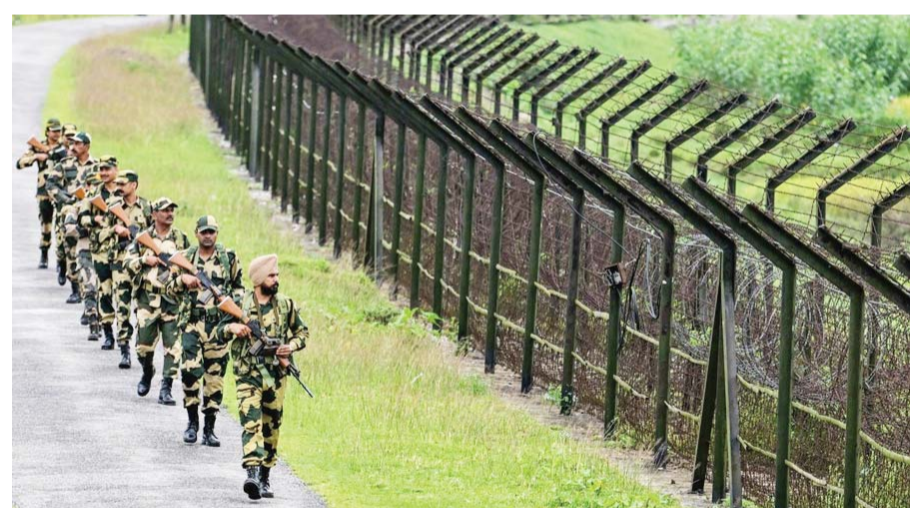
The apex court clarified that it was not expressing any opinion on the merits of the dispute pending before the Delhi High Court under Section 34 of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act. Senior advocate Mukul Rohatgi, appearing for SpiceJet, submitted before

the Justice Narasimha-led Bench that the airline sector had been severely impacted by the ongoing West Asia crisis, including rising fuel prices and operational disruptions. He argued that SpiceJet, being the smallest player in the aviation sector, was facing acute financial distress and sought time to clear the dues. Rohatgi further submitted that the Cen-

tre had introduced a bailout and emergency credit line scheme for airlines, under which funds were expected to be released by November. The senior counsel stated that the airline had offered immovable property as security and was taking steps to sell it, but immediate liquidation was not feasible as required under the Delhi High Court's order.

The dispute arises out of execution proceedings linked to an arbitral award in favour of Maran and Kal Airways. The proceedings are being heard alongside SpiceJet's challenge to the award under Section 34 of the Arbitration and Conciliation Act.

## Bangladesh Border Drone Threat Raises Infiltration, Smuggling Concerns



New Delhi, May 22 (UNI) The sighting of a drone along the India-Bangladesh border has put the security agencies on high alert. A Made in China drone was found near the Durgabari Outpost of the Border Security Force (BSF) in West Tripura district. The drone is being taken to Delhi for forensic examination. Tripura food The initial assessment suggested that it was not a civilian drone. It had two high-resolution cameras, which indicates that it was not a civilian drone.

There are Intelligence reports that drone activity along the India-Bangladesh border may go up. It would be used more often by rogue elements who would want information on the position of the Indian security forces.

The data will then be used for carrying out illegal infiltration, cattle, drug smuggling, and counterfeiting. Officials point out that this is similar to what they got to witness at the Line of Control and the International border

with Pakistan. The security agencies had sighted drones in smaller numbers in Punjab and later in Jammu and Kashmir. Initially, there were just reconnaissance missions, but later consignments of arms and drugs were being dropped off. In the days to come, some elements in Bangladesh are likely to ramp up the use of drones.

The Intelligence agencies assess that with the government in Bangladesh not sharing good ties with India, there is every likelihood that infiltrations of illegal immigrants may take place in very large numbers. Online learning It is not just the rogue drones used by anti-social elements that India is worried about. The Bangladesh military had recently acquired the Turkish-made Bayraktar TB2 drones. These have been in operation near the Indian border. These drones have been flying within Bangladesh's territory and have been carrying out surveillance missions.

The Bayraktar TB2 is an armed, unnamed aerial vehicle (UAV) that is manufactured in Turkey. It includes a TB2 UAV platform, a ground control station, a ground data terminal, a remote display terminal, and advanced base modules. The sighting of the TB2 is not uncommon. These have been in operation since 2024. Such drones have also been sighted near Meghalaya, which shares a 443 km border with Bangladesh. This unusual activity by the drones was reported near Shore and Stella in the East Khasi Hills district.

The agencies have alerted the BSF that such sightings may go up. The challenge would be to keep a watch on the drones used by the Bangladesh military and the rogue elements. India has already spruced up surveillance efforts in the region. Online learning However, with time and given the current situation, the security officials will have to ramp up efforts further.

## Yogi Warns of Stern Action Against Misuse of Drones Amid Panic in UP, Uttarakhand

Lucknow, May 22 (IANS) Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has warned that those spreading panic with illegal use of drones will be booked under the Gangster Act. He said that if needed, the illegal drone operators will be booked under the National Security Act (NSA), the Chief Minister's Office has said in a statement.

Pointing out that operating drones without prior permission is banned, he said those taking the law into their own hands will not be tolerated. The Chief Minister said that strict action will be taken against the accused. He made it clear that those spreading



rumours will not be tolerated and strict action will be taken against them.

The Chief Minister directed the Additional Chief Secretary (Home) and Director General of Police to review the illegal activities concerning drones in all districts. He called for strict vigilance and the establishment of a drone monitor-

ing system across the state. CM Adityanath also directed the officials to conduct routine patrolling in the districts and instil a sense of security among people.

He said that those misusing the technology will face stern action. The Chief Minister's remarks come amid growing concerns over drone use in unlawful activities. Notably, drone activities were reported across Uttarakhand and Uttar Pradesh in recent days, triggering panic. Earlier this week, two people were arrested in Muzaffarnagar, Uttar Pradesh, for using pigeons and fitting green lights on them to create an illusion of a drone.

## NEET PG 2025: QR Code Admit Card Mandatory for Candidates

New Delhi, May 22 (UNI) The National Board of Examinations in Medical Sciences (NBEMS) is set to conduct the NEET PG 2025 examination. The examination, which is a key gateway for admission into postgraduate medical courses in India, will be held in a single shift from 9:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. The computer-based test will take place at multiple centres nationwide under strict examination protocols.

Candidates will be allowed entry into the examination centres between 7:00 a.m. and 8:30 a.m.. No entry will be permitted after the gate closing time. Access to the login system will be granted at 8:45 a.m., and candidates

are expected to remain seated in their designated exam halls throughout the exam.

NEET PG serves as the national eligibility-cum-ranking examination for admissions to various postgraduate medical courses, including Doctor of Medicine (MD), Master of Surgery (MS), Postgraduate Diploma programmes, post-MBBS DNB, six-year DrNB courses, and NBEMS diploma programmes. Over two lakh candidates are expected to take part in the highly competitive examination this year. As per the instructions issued by the NBEMS, candidates must carry a printed copy of the NEET PG 2025 admit card bearing a barcode or QR code.

## Punjab to Provide Prescriptions, Test Reports via WhatsApp Chatbot: CM Mann

Chandigarh, May 22 (UNI) To impart quality health services, Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Sunday announced the government would open 200 new Aam Aadmi Clinics, taking the total number of such clinics to 1,081. Addressing the gathering at a function to mark inauguration of WhatsApp Chatbot for 881 Aam Aadmi Clinics, the Chief Minister said "it is a historic day in the healthcare sector of Punjab as a total of 881 Aam Aadmi Clinics across the state have been connected to a WhatsApp Chatbot".

He said these clinics cater to nearly 70,000 patients daily and in today's digital age, the WhatsApp Chatbot



will be most beneficial for patients. Mann said this initiative is expected to bring revolutionary changes in healthcare services.

The Chief Minister said as

approximately 90 per cent of Punjabis own a smartphone, they can now be directly reached through WhatsApp. He said patients would now receive complete

health-related information via WhatsApp and doctor's prescription slips would be accessible through the chatbot. CM Mann said diagnostic test reports would also be shared and patients would receive reminders about their next consultation dates from the doctor. The Chief Minister said regular WhatsApp updates will be provided on care for elderly people with diabetes or blood pressure, pregnant women, and newborns. He said it would eliminate the need for patients to physically store prescriptions or medications, as they can access the information anytime on WhatsApp. Most importantly, Mann said, the

patients can instantly share their reports with family members or consult another doctor through WhatsApp. The Chief Minister said the Health Department will also maintain a digital database of patients, their ailments, and treatments. He said Punjab would soon be launching 200 more Aam Aadmi Clinics to ensure quality healthcare services for all, adding the government is committed to providing free medical treatment to every citizen.

CM Mann said Punjab is also the first state in the country to implement the 'Mukhya Mantri Sehat Yojana', which provides medical treatment of up to Rs 10 lakh per family.

# IPL 2026: SRH crush RCB by 55 runs in Hyderabad run-fest, seal statement win

Hyderabad, May 23 (UNI) Going into the game, RCB wanted to win but also wanted to ensure they didn't slip outside the top two should they lose. After SRH pumped 255 for 4 in 20 overs, the equation became clear - RCB had to avoid losing by 90 or more runs.

The start given by their new opener, Venkatesh, calmed the nerves. He gave Pat Cummins a four-six jab in the first over, and saved his best for the fourth over delivered by left-arm wrist-spinner Shivang Kumar. He punished Shivang for two sixes in one over, with a boundary sandwiched in between. Venkatesh fell for a 19-ball 44 but by then RCB

had already scored 60 in 4.3 overs. Even though Virat Kohli (15) failed to leave a mark in the game with the bat, a spunky 21 from No. 3 Devdutt Padikkal ensured RCB stayed on course for 166 even if the chase looked clear - RCB had to avoid losing by 90 or more runs. Hussain, who delivered 1 for 31 in four overs, was a major reason why RCB could not push on.

Patidar scored his fourth half-century of the season, staying in from the sixth over to the 19th. His 39-ball 56 included crisp boundaries off Eshan Malinga, Cummins and Harshal Patel, but fell to part-timer Travis Head. Krunal stayed till the end with an unbeaten 41 in

31 balls as RCB finished on a commendable 200 for 4 by the end. Dropped in the sixth, seventh and eighth overs, Abhishek made full use of the chances RCB's fielders offered him. On a flat surface with no grass, he did not let purple-cap holder Bhuvneshwar Kumar settle. His early boundaries over the off-side against Bhuvneshwar's awayswingers moved into his takedown of Suyash Sharma's googly and Romario Shepherd's seam-up balls. Abhishek was finally out in the ninth over, but by then his turbo-charged innings had SRH almost touching triple-digits.

Kishan had three fifties against RCB in his last three



outings, and on Friday, he made it four in a row with a 46-ball 79. While Abhishek was going, Kishan took his time to score nine off his first ten balls, but then found his groove.

His best shot of the night was probably the leg-side slog towards the bigger boundary against Krunal in the 11th over, a sign that timing and form continued to be on his side. A sixth 50-plus score for Kishan this season also made IPL 2026 his most prolific as a batter. His sweeps, cuts and pulls allowed SRH to pump 73 runs across overs 11 to 15.

Klaasen's story was similar, starting off with only five runs in nine balls, but

one that was unlocked with his takedown of Josh Hazlewood in the 13th over. One six over cow corner and two more over long-on made Hazlewood leak 27. His effortless loft of Bhuvneshwar over extra cover took him close to yet another landmark, and he brought up his sixth half-century of the season in the 16th over. He fell in the 17th over to a low-arm slinger from Krunal for 52, but not before becoming the first player to cross 600 runs while batting at No. 4 or lower in a T20 tournament. ## National Senior Athletics: Animesh Kujur Sets National 100m Record, Wins Ticket To Glasgow CWG

Ranchi, May 22 (GNS): Odi-sha's ace sprinter Animesh Kujur set the national men's 100m record in the semifinal round of the 29th National Senior Athletics Federation Competitions in Ranchi on Friday, to win a ticket to the Glasgow Commonwealth Games. Seema also achieved CWG qualification mark in women's discus throw.

Kujur, 22, bettered the national record to 10.15 seconds in the second semifinal round on day one of the 29th National Senior Athletics Federation Competition here at Ranchi's Birsa Munda Stadium. The Commonwealth Games qualification time in men's 100m was 10.16 seconds. The spot-



light was on men's 100m sprinters on Friday. The national record was shattered twice within a short span of time. Gurinder Singh, dominating the first semis, clocked 10.17 seconds to better the previous national record of 10.18 seconds set by Kujur last year.

Excitement reached its

zenith as a few minutes later, Kujur, racing in the second semis, clocked 10.15 seconds to reclaim his national record. "It's all about hard work," says jubilant Animesh Kujur on winning tickets to Glasgow.

Both Kujur and Singh also improved the meet record of 10.25 set by Manikanta

Hoblihar in 2025.

Seema was the second athlete on day one to achieve the CWG qualification mark in the women's discus throw. Her gold-winning throw of 57.29m was better than the CWG qualification mark of 56.85m.

Fierce competition was also witnessed at the jumping arena on the opening day. India's two heavyweights in women's long jump—Shaili Singh and Ancy Sojan—battled it out to stay ahead of the other. Eventually, it was Ancy's day out as she raced to victory with a distance of 6.75m, bettering the meet record of 6.64m set by Shaili Singh last year in Kochi.

## All-rounder Vijay Shankar announces retirement from all forms of Indian cricket

Chennai, May 22 (GNS): All-rounder Vijay Shankar on Friday announced his retirement from all forms of Indian cricket, bringing the curtains down on a career that saw him represent India in both white ball formats and feature in the 2019 Men's ODI World Cup.

Shankar, a mainstay for Tamil Nadu in domestic cricket, played 12 ODIs and nine T20Is for India, amassing 324 runs in all and picking nine scalps. He was surprisingly preferred ahead of Ambati Rayudu in the main squad and played three matches before a toe injury ended his tournament early, with Mayang Agarwal replacing him.



In his retirement note, Shankar said he now aims to 'pursue new opportunities and play more cricket.' "A HEARTFELT THANK YOU. Cricket is my life. I started playing when I was 10, and 25 years later, I am grateful and blessed to have played at every level and to the highest level. Representing our country will always be one

of my proudest and happiest moments. "I have decided to retire from playing domestic cricket and IPL to pursue new opportunities and play more cricket. Thank you will not suffice for letting me do what I love. Eternally grateful. Thankful to BCCI and the Indian Cricket Team - many learnings, countless memories, and various inspirations!

"Representing the country will be my highest badge of honour. Bowling the last over at India's 500th ODI at Nagpur and my First ball, first wicket at the 2019 World Cup are moments I will hold onto forever!" wrote Shankar on his social media accounts on Friday.

In the Indian Premier League (IPL), Shankar played 78 games and turned out for Chennai Super Kings, Sunrisers Hyderabad, Delhi Capitals, and Gujarat Titans, including in their title-winning run in 2022. In domestic cricket, Shankar captained Tamil Nadu to the Vijay Hazare, Deodhar, and Syed Mushtaq Ali Trophy titles before playing for Tripura in the last season.

## India's fintech sector set to grow at 31 pc CAGR in next four years

New Delhi, May 23 (GNS) The Indian fintech sector is expected to grow at an impressive 31 per cent compound annual growth rate over the next four years, a report said. The report from KPMG India said that the country's fintech ecosystem is transitioning from rapid expansion to a phase characterised by resilience, governance, and profitable scale. This shift is supported by robust digital public infrastructure, including UPI, Aadhaar, and the Account Aggregator framework, the report said.

Approximately 60 per cent of total fintech funding in the first half of 2025 was directed toward lending and payments segments, underscoring investor confidence in mature, stable sub-sectors, the report



said. After the peak in funding seen in 2021, the deal activity has rebounded in H1 2025 with 12 deals exceeding \$50 million, compared to just 1 in H1 2024. This recovery signals strategic investor focus on scale and quality, KPMG India said. "India's fintech evolution is entering a new phase—one where embedded finance, powered by responsible AI, re-

defines how financial services integrate into daily life. Innovation must now be paired with governance, resilience and ethical safeguards. Talent will be the true differentiator, shaping a workforce ready to navigate advanced technologies and regulatory complexity," said Akhilesh Tuteja, Partner and Head, Clients and Markets, KPMG in India.

## NITI Aayog unveils roadmap on AI to empower 490 million informal workers

New Delhi, May 23 (UNI) NITI Aayog on Wednesday released a pioneering study to systematically explore how artificial intelligence (AI) and frontier technologies can be harnessed to transform the lives and livelihoods of India's 490 million informal workers who are the backbone of the nation's economy. While global discourse on AI has largely centred around white-collar jobs and the formal economy, the landmark study titled 'AI for Inclusive Societal Development' developed in partnership with Deloitte, shifts the spotlight to the informal sector, which contributes nearly half of India's GDP yet remains excluded from formal sys-



tems of protection, opportunity, and productivity. Jayant Chaudhary, Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Skill Development and Entrepreneurship and Minister of State for Education, said, "Empowering India's informal workers is not just an economic priority, it is a moral imperative". "The goal of Digital Skill-ing in AI for workers aligns perfectly with our national skilling agenda by leverag-

ing AI and frontier technologies to make learning adaptive, accessible, and demand-driven. By bringing together government, industry, and civil society, this mission will ensure that every worker—whether a farmer, artisan, or health-care aide—has the skills, tools, and opportunities needed to thrive in the digital economy of tomorrow," said the minister.

The report emphasises

that AI will not automatically transform the informal sector. Technology alone cannot break systemic barriers. Without deliberate human intervention, focused investments, and an enabling ecosystem, the promise of AI risks remaining out of reach for those who need it most. To address this, NITI Aayog has called for Mission Digital ShramSetu — a proposed national mission to create

the roadmap and ecosystem that will make AI accessible, affordable, and impactful for every worker. The mission will harness AI, blockchain, immersive learning, and other frontier technologies to dismantle structural constraints ranging from financial insecurity and limited market access to lack of skilling and social protection and empower informal workers with tools and platforms that amplify their skills, increase productivity, and ensure dignity in work. This proposed mission emphasises on building inclusion requires human intent, coordinated action, and collaboration across government, industry, academia, and civil society.

## Govt seeks public feedback on draft National Labour & Employment Policy

New Delhi, May 23 (GNS) The Ministry of Labour and Employment has released the draft National Labour & Employment Policy - Shram Shakti Niti 2025 for public consultation. The draft policy presents a renewed vision for a fair, inclusive, and future-ready world of work aligned with the national aspiration of Viksit Bharat @2047.

Rooted in India's civilisational ethos of rama dharma - the dignity and moral value of work, the policy envisions a labour ecosystem that ensures protection, productivity, and participation for every worker. It seeks to create a balanced framework that upholds workers' welfare while enabling enterprises to grow



and generate sustainable livelihoods, according to an official statement released on Wednesday.

Shram Shakti Niti 2025 positions the Ministry of Labour & Employment (MoLE) as a proactive Employment Facilitator, driving convergence among workers, employers, and training institutions through trusted, technology-led systems.

The National Career Service (NCS) platform will serve as India's Digital Public Infrastructure for Employment, enabling transparent and inclusive job matching, credential verification, and skill alignment.

Through open APIs, multilingual access, and AI-driven innovation, the NCS-DPI will connect opportunity with talent across Tier-II and

Tier-III cities, rural districts, and MSME clusters, making employment facilitation a nationwide public good, the statement said. The policy also places strong emphasis on universal social security, occupational safety and health, women and youth empowerment, and the creation of green and technology-enabled jobs.

It aims to build a resilient and continuously skilled workforce capable of meeting the demands of emerging technologies, climate transitions, and global value chains. By integrating key national databases such as EPFO, ESIC, e-Shram, and NCS into a unified Labour Stack, the policy envisions an inclusive and interoperable digital ecosystem that

supports lifelong learning, social protection, and income security.

The draft policy reflects extensive stakeholder consultations and emphasises cooperative federalism, evidence-based policymaking, and digital transparency. It provides a long-term framework for coordinated action among the Centre, states, industry, and social partners to ensure that the benefits of growth are shared widely and equitably, the statement said.

The policy also proposes strengthening labour law compliance through simplified digital mechanisms and trust-based governance. It encourages the adoption of transparent and accountable systems that reduce

the compliance burden on enterprises while ensuring effective protection of workers' rights and timely grievance redressal.

Another key focus area of the draft policy is enhancing employment opportunities in high-growth sectors such as manufacturing, logistics, healthcare, tourism, renewable energy, and the gig and platform economy. It seeks to formalise informal employment and improve access to decent work opportunities for migrant and unorganised workers across the country.

The policy further highlights the importance of industry-linked skilling and apprenticeships to bridge the gap between education and employability.

## Investor participation surges to 13.4 cr in 5 years: SEBI Chairman

Mumbai, May 23 (GNS) The focus of the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) on digital transformation, such as e-KYC, simplified onboarding and mobile-first investment platforms, has led to investor participation rising to 134 million over the past five years, SEBI Chairman Tuhin Kanta Pandey said.

Participating in a panel discussion during the Global Fintech Fest (GFF) 2025 here, Pandey said several technology-led initiatives, such as the Investor Risk Reduction Access Platform and a Unified Investor App, have strengthened investor protection and market efficiency. It has led to con-

solidated access to holdings, transaction history, e-voting, and proxy advisory recommendations. "Grievance resolutions too have been streamlined with Digital Locker and an upgraded SEBI Complaints Redressal System (SCORES)," the SEBI Chairman added. Talking about market efficiency, Pandey highlighted India's transition to the "T+1 settlement" that has shortened the financial transaction settlement cycle, making it one of the fastest globally. He also drew attention to the expansion of Application Supported by Blocked Amount (ASBA) through UPI for secondary markets, ensuring safer.

# Telangana aims to become USD 3 trillion economy by 2047: Bhatti

Hyderabad, May 22 (GNS) Telangana Deputy Chief Minister Mallu Bhatti Vikramarka on Friday said the Telangana Government is committed to transforming the state into a USD 3 trillion economy by 2047, driven by rapid growth, urbanisation, infrastructure development, and inclusive welfare measures. Addressing the 49th State Level Bankers' Committee (SLBC) meeting at Praja Bhavan, the Deputy Chief Minister said Telangana's economy is growing at 10.7 per cent, significantly higher than the national average of 8.2 per cent. He noted that the state's per capita income has reached Rs 4.18 lakh compared to the national average of Rs 2.1 lakh.

Sources said allegations had surfaced against Vamsi Mohan regarding large-scale irregularities and



alleged misappropriation of government lands during his tenure in the Revenue Department. He had earlier served as Revenue Divisional Officer in areas including Serilingampally.

The allegations include the alleged misappropriation of nearly eight acres of land in Abdullapurmet and Piglipuram. It is further alleged that the land was registered in the name of his father-in-law and later sold to a real estate developer.

# Hyderabad court jails man 60 days for harassing parents

Hyderabad, May 22 (UNI) A local court in Hyderabad sentenced a 44-year-old man to 60 days of imprisonment for allegedly harassing and ill-treating his elderly parents within the limits of Narayanguda Police Station.

According to police, the accused, G Srinivas, had been repeatedly harassing his aged parents. Based on a complaint lodged by the victims, Narayanguda Police registered a case against him under Section 70B of the City Police Act and Section 115(2) of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita (BNS).

The investigation was conducted by Sub-Inspector J. Srikanth Reddy, who collected evidence and produced the accused before the Special



Judicial Magistrate Court at Nampally.

After examining the facts and evidence in STC No. 1780/2026, the court presided over by Judge M. Bhasker found the accused guilty and sentenced him to two months' imprisonment along with a fine of Rs 50.

Police stated that the action reflects their commitment to safeguarding senior citizens and warned that strict legal action would be taken against individuals found harassing or neglecting elderly parents.

# BJP to tour procurement centres over farmers' distress: Maheshwar Reddy

Hyderabad, May 22 (GNS) Telangana BJP Legislature Party leader Yeleti Maheshwar Reddy on Friday alleged that farmers across Telangana are facing severe hardship due to the State government's failure to ensure smooth procurement of paddy, maize and sorghum crops.

Addressing a media conference at the Bharatiya Janata Party Telangana state office in Nampally, he claimed that procurement centres were suffering from shortages of trucks and gunny bags, forcing farmers to wait for days to sell their produce. He also alleged that middlemen and millers were exploiting farmers and accused the government of deducting four kilograms per bag during procure-



ment. Maheshwar Reddy criticised the Congress government for allegedly failing to fulfil its election promises, including the procurement of every grain produced by farmers and providing Rs 7,500 per acre under the Rythu Bharosa scheme.

He questioned Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy over claims that 80 per cent of procurement had been completed, asserting that only around 24 to 35 per cent of pro-

urement had taken place so far.

The BJP leader announced that BJP MLAs, MLCs and MPs would undertake a three-day tour of procurement centres across the state beginning Monday under the leadership of Telangana BJP president N Ramchander Rao to assess farmers' problems and expose the "ground reality" of procurement operations.

He said the BJP would continue to stand by farmers and would announce its future course of action after completing the tour. Maheshwar Reddy also alleged that delayed payments to farmers were adding to their distress, with many cultivators struggling to clear debts and prepare for the next agricultural season.

# Farmers' Plight at Grain Procurement Centers

# Government must wake up from its slumber : Kappati Panduranga Reddy

Hyderabad, May 22 (GNS) Although the State Government boasts of being pro-farmer, the ground reality at grain procurement centers remains deplorable. Kappati Panduranga Reddy—former Chairman of the Ranga Reddy District Library Corporation and a TRS leader—stated that it is highly unfortunate that the concerned government machinery remains indifferent, even as farmers wait endlessly to sell their harvested produce.

He noted that out of the grain transported by farm-

ers to the procurement centers established across various mandals in the district, less than 50% has actually been purchased.

Under the pretext of adhering to government-mandated quality standards—and using the excuse of "excessive moisture" even for properly dried grain—officials are looting farmers by deducting a weightage of 5 to 8 kilograms per quintal.

Farmers and laborers are enduring severe hardships at these procurement centers due to the complete



lack of basic amenities such as drinking water and shade. Furthermore, tarpaulins are unavailable to protect the grain from getting wet, leaving farmers in constant fear of unseasonal rains.

Even after successfully selling their grain, a state of confusion prevails as there is no clarity regarding when the proceeds will be credited to the farmers' bank accounts. Consequently, farmers are being forced to turn to private moneylenders to secure the necessary capital for their next cultivation cycle.

He urged the government to expedite the process of crediting the additional bonus of Rs. 500 per quintal—intended for farmers who cultivate fine-variety paddy—directly

into their bank accounts. The government must finally shake off its slumber and provide the necessary quantity of gunny bags. Strict action must be taken against millers and officials who harass farmers under the pretext of moisture content levels. Recognizing the hardships faced by the farming community, they demanded that the procurement of grain be completed on a war footing; failing which, they warned that they would intensify their protests on behalf of the farmers.

# NIMS creates national record with 2,000 kidney transplants

Hyderabad, May 22 (GNS) Nizam's Institute of Medical Sciences (NIMS) has achieved a rare milestone by becoming the first government hospital in the country to successfully perform 2,000 kidney transplants, marking a significant achievement in public healthcare.

Announcing the accomplishment on Friday, NIMS Director Dr Beerappa said the hospital performed its first kidney transplant in 1989 and has now success-

fully completed its 2,000th transplant surgery. He attributed the achievement to the dedicated efforts and exceptional performance of the doctors and staff of the Urology and Nephrology departments.

Dr Beerappa expressed gratitude to Telangana Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy and Health Minister Damodar Rajanarasimha for extending full support to NIMS in delivering advanced medical care to economically weaker sections. He stated



that NIMS has given a new lease of life to nearly 2,000 kidney patients, particularly benefiting poor and middle-class families. According to him, nearly 95 per cent of kidney transplant surger-

ies at the hospital were carried out completely free of cost under the Aarogyasri Health Care Trust and the Chief Minister's Relief Fund (CMRF). He added that the government is also providing lifelong post-transplant medication free of cost under the Aarogyasri scheme.

Dr Beerappa congratulated Dr Rahul Raj and the Urology Department team for successfully handling highly complex kidney transplant procedures, including surgeries involving

multiple blood vessels, pediatric transplants, and re-transplants.

He also noted that NIMS conducted the first robotic kidney transplant in a government hospital in South India. Meanwhile, Health Minister Damodar Rajanarasimha congratulated the NIMS medical team on the achievement and said the government is expanding organ transplant services in government hospitals to make advanced treatment more accessible to the poor.

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
