### India can become global manufacturing, pharma hub: Piyush Goyal



New Delhi, June 9 (GNS): Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said on Tuesday that India is well-positioned to serve the world as an innovator, manufacturer, reliable supplier of affordable medicines, partner in advanced healthcare technologies, and destination for contract manufacturing.

Addressing the Global Ambassador Meet on the Pharmaceutical Sector here, the minister noted that Indian medicines are widely accepted across global markets owing to the industry's established quality standards and manufacturing capabilities. He also highlighted the sector's growing focus on research, innovation, advanced technologies and higher-value products, and invited global companies to invest, manufacture and collaborate in India.

Goyal noted that India's pharmaceutical exports have increased from about \$14 billion in FY 2014-15 to about \$31 billion in FY 2025-26, with medicines reaching patients in more than 200 countries. He added that while India continues to maintain its leadership in generic medicines, the sector is increasingly moving towards innovation-driven growth.

Describing iPHEx 2026 as an important platform for showcasing India's pharmaceutical and healthcare capabilities to the global market, he urged Ambassadors, High Commissioners and representatives of foreign

missions to encourage participation from their respective countries.

India's pharmaceutical sector reflects the country's commitment to ensuring wider access to quality and affordable healthcare across the world, he added.

Commerce Secretary Rajesh Agrawal outlined India's goal of achieving \$50 billion in pharmaceutical exports by 2030 through quality, innovation, regulatory excellence and market diversification. He noted that India has more than 10,500 manufacturing units and over 60,000 generic brands across 60 therapeutic categories.

Agrawal further highlighted that over 60 per cent of India's pharmaceutical exports are destined for highly regulated markets, reflecting growing international confidence in India's pharmaceutical manufacturing capabilities and quality standards.

iPHEx 2026 will be held at Bharat Mandapam here from September 7 to 9. The event is expected to feature more than 700 exhibitors, over 600 overseas business delegates and around 25,000 domestic visitors. The Curtain Raiser for the Global Drug Regulatory Conclave 2026, scheduled for July 30-31, and iPHEx 2026 were launched on the occasion. A promotional video showcasing both events was also released.

## Home Minister Amit Shah Launches Land Port Management System

New Delhi, June 9 (GNS): Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Tuesday launched a Land Port Management System (LPMS) to improve border and internal security, underscoring the Prime Minister Narendra Modi-led government's promise to secure the frontier and promote cross-border trade.

Calling the creation of the Land Ports Authority of India (LPAI) an outcome of a recommendation made in a report, Home Minister Shah said that Prime Minister Modi's vision has not only made it a first layer of security but also as an agency that makes trade easier and more secure. "It has also acted as a bridge of connectivity between people on both sides.



It has added a new dimension to the concept of how land ports can function. We have also linked how land ports can become ambassadors of our culture and heritage," he added.

An official statement said that the LPMS is a state-of-the-art digital platform designed to integrate operations across land ports into a unified system. "It enables secure, real-time exchange of logistics and regulatory information, bringing land ports at par with digital systems operational at airports and seaports," the statement added. This initiative underscores the Prime Minister Modi-led

Union government's commitment to smart border management, enhancing efficiency, transparency, and security in cross-border trade and passenger movement through technology-driven solutions, an official statement said.

The Union Home Minister also inaugurated the newly-

developed stakeholder accommodation facilities at the Dawki (Meghalaya) and Srimantapur (Tripura) Land Ports, further reinforcing infrastructure support for border security personnel and other valuable stakeholders.

The launch of LPMS marked a landmark step in India's journey towards

modern, technology-enabled smart border management system, reflecting the nation's strategic focus on strengthening trade facilitation, connectivity, and national security and 'Viksit Bharat by 2047'.

"As a neutral and open platform, LPMS will facilitate seamless coordination among various stakeholders, including government agencies and private operators, thereby reducing delays and enhancing operational efficiency," it added.

"The system introduces end-to-end digital workflows for cargo and passenger processing, including slot booking, payments, tracking, and single-window clearances," it said.

### 3 Foreign Universities get nod to open campuses in india

New Delhi, June 9 (GNS): The Education Ministry on Tuesday issued Letters of Approval (LoPs) to three globally renowned Foreign Higher Education Institutions, with Minister Dharmendra Pradhan describing the development as a step towards advancing the internationalisation vision of NEP 2020. He said the establishment of campuses by the University of Bristol, the University of York, and the University of New South Wales in India will further strengthen quality education, global learning partnerships, and research collaboration.

He noted that, with Bristol and York establishing campuses in Mumbai and UNSW setting up its campus in Bengaluru, these universities were aligning with two of India's most dynamic knowledge, tech-



nology, and innovation hotspots. Describing Bengaluru as the new Silicon Valley of the eastern world, Pradhan welcomed the three Universities to India and congratulated them on becoming part of the country's growing global higher education ecosystem. The Letters of Approval were handed over by the

Secretary, Department of Higher Education and Chairman, University Grants Commission, Vineet Joshi, said an official statement. The University of Bristol will establish its Mumbai Enterprise Campus, with proposed programmes in areas including Immersive Arts, Finance, Data Science.

### India reaffirms commitment To peace and stability in Afghanistan

New Delhi, June 9 (GNS): Highlighting the enduring civilisational links between India and Afghanistan, the Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) on Tuesday reaffirmed New Delhi's commitment to peace, stability and development in Afghanistan and the region.

Addressing a weekly media briefing in New Delhi, MEA spokesperson Randhir Jaiswal cited India's statement at the UN Assistance Mission in Afghanistan (UNAMA) briefing, underscoring India's continued humanitarian assistance and development partnership with the Afghanistan.

"Afghanistan, we had a meeting yesterday in New York where you saw our Permanent Representative (PR), he made a statement on the UNAMA briefing where we have reiterated that India and Afghanistan



are contiguous neighbours. As civilisational states, our ties have spanned centuries. We stand in favor of peace and stability in Afghanistan and in the region so as to foster development and stability in the region. We also talked about our development cooperation, our longstanding friendship and development cooperation that we continue to do in Afghanistan on the side of food security, on the side of medicine, pharma support and health," Jaiswal stated.

### India's west asia approach is shaped by distinct ties with all players: EAM

New Delhi, June 9 (GNS): External Affairs Minister (EAM) S Jaishankar on Tuesday said that India's approach towards West Asia is guided by its deep and distinct relationships with all key stakeholders in the region, including the United States, Iran, Israel and the Gulf countries.

Speaking about India's evolving foreign policy under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi during an interview with DD News, EAM Jaishankar said New Delhi's interests today are far broader and more extensive compared to the



previous era and that the country's diplomatic engagement, conduct and outlook naturally reflect those expanding interests.

"Our interests are much bigger and much more spread out than in the earlier eras. So, when your

interests are much deeper, then naturally our engagement, our behaviour, and our attitude reflect that. I'll give you an example. Let's take what is currently happening in the Gulf. So, you have essentially four parties. I'm simplifying it a bit. So, there is the US, there is Iran, there is Israel, and there is, for the sake of the argument, putting the Gulf together as a single party, though they are different," the EAM stated.

"Now, just look at it from our point of view today as opposed to how we may have approached it hypothetically before.

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## Mamata Banerjee meets Sonia Gandhi regarding growing crisis in TMC

New Delhi, June 9 (GNS) Trinamool Congress (TMC) chief Mamata Banerjee met senior Congress leader Sonia Gandhi in New Delhi amid escalating political challenges facing the Trinamool Congress following its recent electoral setback in West Bengal.

The meeting took place at Sonia Gandhi's residence at 10 Janpath, a day after leaders of the opposition INDIA bloc gathered in the national capital and emphasized the need for unity and better coordination among alliance partners. The two leaders had also shared a warm interaction during the opposition meeting, highlighting efforts to project opposition cohesion.

According to sources, the



discussions focused on the future strategy of opposition parties, coordination within the INDIA alliance, and the evolving political situation in West Bengal, where the Trinamool Congress is grappling with internal dissent.

The meeting assumes significance as the TMC faces one of its most serious internal crises in recent years.

Reports indicate that a group of rebel MPs has sought to distance itself from the party leadership, while several legislators have also challenged the authority of the current leadership structure.

The political turmoil intensified after a section of TMC MPs reportedly expressed support for the BJP-led NDA, while rebel leaders have

claimed the backing of a substantial number of lawmakers. The developments have triggered concerns over the future direction of the party and its role in national opposition politics. The closed-door meeting between Banerjee and Gandhi is being viewed as an important effort to strengthen opposition coordination and discuss political strategy at a time when the TMC is confronting internal rebellion and organisational challenges. Political observers believe the discussions could play a key role in shaping opposition unity in Parliament and beyond, especially as the INDIA bloc seeks to maintain a united front against the ruling BJP.

## Patna Court stays arrest of Khan Sir in coaching institute firing case

Patna, June 9 (GNS) A Patna court on Tuesday ordered a stay on the arrest of popular educator Faisal Khan, widely known as Khan Sir, until further directions in connection with a case linked to a recent firing incident involving his security personnel.

According to his lawyer, Arvind Kumar Mouar, Khan Sir had been named in an FIR related to an incident in which gunshots were allegedly fired by guards during an attack on his coaching institute earlier this month.

"The court has stayed his arrest till further orders and has directed the police to produce the case diary and other relevant records on



the next hearing," Mouar told reporters in Patna.

Khan Sir had moved an anticipatory bail plea before the court on Monday. His legal team argued that all relevant facts had been presented before the judiciary in accordance with the law. The court is expected to

take up the matter again after reviewing the case diary. The next date of hearing has not yet been fixed.

The court also sought details regarding two guards who were detained by police in connection with the firing incident. Their hearing is scheduled for the fol-

lowing day, once the case diary is submitted.

The case stems from an incident on June 2 night, when around 15-20 unidentified individuals allegedly vandalised the Khan Global Studies Institute in Patna and pelted stones at the premises. In response, gunshots were reportedly fired by security guards at the site. Police had earlier detained two guards associated with the institute as part of the investigation.

The matter is currently under judicial consideration, and Khan Sir has been granted protection from coercive action while cooperating with the ongoing investigation.

## MP Congress candidate Meenakshi Natarajan's Rajya Sabha nomination rejected, party protests

Bhopal, June 9 (GNS) The upcoming elections to three Rajya Sabha seats in Madhya Pradesh took a dramatic turn on Tuesday with the nomination of Congress candidate Meenakshi Natarajan being rejected on charges of concealing information about a case in the affidavit.

"Natarajan's nomination has been rejected by the re-

turning officer on the grounds of hiding information about a case," an MP Assembly official told. Senior lawyer and Rajya Sabha MP Vivek Tankha told PTI Videos, "I have personally examined the nomination papers. This is no longer a case of vote theft, but rather a case of seat theft. Democracy has been openly robbed. You may ask how? She (Natarajan) had not concealed any information that was required to be declared. No FIR was filed against her."

A complaint was submitted by BJP candidate Mahesh Kewat, contesting the third Rajya Sabha seat, to the returning officer alleging that

Natarajan deliberately hid information about a case filed against her in Telangana.

Sanket Gupta, the lawyer representing Kewat, told reporters that a criminal case was pending against Natarajan in a Telangana court and this was not mentioned in her affidavit submitted along with the nomination papers.

He said the returning officer rejected her nomination on this basis. "This information has been deliberately concealed. According to Supreme Court guidelines, you are required to provide this information in the affidavit. Kewat had filed an objection to Natarajan's candidacy un-



der this same provision," he added. Gupta claimed several other "deficiencies" were also found in the nomination papers. State minister Kailash Vijayvargiya called it a "victory for justice" and said the

BJP had filed its objection following constitutional procedures. Tankha insisted Natarajan, a former Lok Sabha member from Mandasaur in Madhya Pradesh, faces no FIR. "There was only a notice

under Section 223 of the Code of Criminal Procedure, in which an applicant claimed compensation of Rs 10 crore from her and others. Natarajan objected to that notice, stating that it could not have been sent to her because she had no connection to the case. There was no crime registered, no FIR, and no legal case pending." The Rajya Sabha MP called the nomination rejection a sad development. "So, what could she declare as an FIR or a judicial case? Merely issuing a notice by a court does not, in itself, establish a case or a crime. Without any legal process, an unusual situation was

created, based on which the Bhopal returning officer defeated the winning candidate of a national party. This is extremely sad," Tankha said.

He suggested the Congress should take the matter to the Supreme Court.

"It is a murder of democracy. We understand that an election petition can be filed against this, but in these special circumstances, I would advise my party to go directly to the Supreme Court. The entire matter must be exposed and those responsible must be exposed. If this practice of rejecting nomination papers begins in a democracy, then democracy will cease to exist

in this country. This will be the beginning of the end of democracy," Tankha asserted. Congress's Madhya Pradesh in-charge, Harish Chaudhary, claimed no case had been filed against Natarajan and that the BJP was bringing up such cases to harass her. He maintained Natarajan had just received a show-cause notice from the court, and it was not necessary to mention it in the affidavit.

Election Commission's instructions are clear that information must be provided in the nomination when a case is filed, not upon receiving a notice, Chaudhary argued.

## Tejashwi Yadav welcomes SC's suggestion on voter list revision in Bihar

Patna, June 9 (GNS) A day after the Supreme Court suggested that the Election Commission of India consider Aadhaar card, voter ID card, ration card, and other documents in the Special Intensive Revision (SIR) of the voter list in Bihar, RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav expressed satisfaction over the development.

"I sincerely thank the Supreme Court of India for its suggestion to the Election Commission. We have been raising the same points, questioning why Aadhaar card, ration card, MNREGA job card, and other documents are not being accepted for voter list revision. The Supreme Court has now



echoed these concerns, and we are thankful to the apex court," Tejashwi Yadav said.

The Supreme Court, during a hearing on Thursday, advised the Election Commission to consider these documents during the SIR process in Bihar to facilitate voter verification. CPI-ML National General Secretary Dipankar Bhattacharya also expressed satisfaction over

the Supreme Court's intervention, stating that it addresses the concerns of the common voters of Bihar.

Meanwhile, the SIR process is progressing rapidly in Bihar, with 74.39 per cent of the 7.90 crore voters having submitted their enumeration forms so far. In the second phase of the SIR, Booth Level Officers (BLOs) are conducting door-to-door visits to assist voters in filling and submitting forms. Covering all assembly constituencies, 38 District Election Officers (DEOs), 243 Electoral Registration Officers (EROs), and 963 Assistant Electoral Registration Officers (AEROs) are continuously monitoring the process on the ground.

## Congress not 'anxious' about leadership change in K'taka: D.K Shivakumar

Kolkata, June 9 (GNS) Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Thursday said that though 2025 was not easy considering the Pahalgam terror attack, the tourism sector in Jammu and Kashmir has started bouncing back.

While admitting that the tourists have an area of concern over the Pahalgam massacre, he assured that all necessary actions have been adopted to ensure the safety and security of the tourists there. He said that his assurance could be vouched for by the tourists who visited and returned from Pahalgam recently. CM Abdullah also claimed that there had been a noticeable increase in the number of flights to Jammu



and Kashmir, especially for the ongoing Amarnath Yatra. Speaking at a travel and tourism event here, Omar Abdullah also complimented the role of the Mamata government and the people from West Bengal in expressing solidarity towards the people of Jammu and Kashmir. "The people of West Ben-

gal have always been with us. Our relationship goes a long way, and the basis of this relationship is trust and affection. West Bengal had always stood beside Jammu and Kashmir both politically and economically," he said. Later in the day, CM Abdullah is also scheduled to have a meeting with West Bengal Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee at the state secretariat of Nabanna.

After the Pahalgam tragedy, the Trinamool Congress sent a five-member delegation to Jammu and Kashmir to review the situation. At that time, the members of the delegation also met Omar Abdullah at his official residence there.

## DRDO and IAF successfully test indigenous missile Astra off Odisha coast



Chennai, June 9 (GNS) DMK President and Chief Minister M.K. Stalin on Thursday took a sharp dig at AIADMK General Secretary Edappadi K. Palaniswami's statewide campaign 'Save Tamil Nadu', stating there was no need to save a state that has already been rescued from the misrule of the previous AIADMK regime. Instead, he quipped, Palaniswami should focus on "saving the AIADMK from the BJP's clutches."

Speaking at a public function in Tiruvarur where he inaugurated completed projects, laid foundation stones for new ones, and distributed welfare assistance, CM Stalin said the Dravidian model government under his leadership is a continuation of the vision of late leader M. Karunanidhi. "This government has ensured all-round development across sectors," he said. Highlighting key achievements in the agriculture sector, CM Stalin pointed out that the Mettur dam has been releasing water on the customary date of June 12 only under the current DMK regime.

He said this has led to increased paddy cultivation and higher food production. "Farmers are also getting better prices for their produce," Stalin added.

Announcing a slew of development projects for Tiruvarur district, CM Stalin said a new commercial complex would be built in the Jubilee Market area at a cost of Rs 11 crore and also announced the establishment of a Tiruvarur Model School in Nannilam at a cost of Rs 56 crore, a Government Arts and Science College for Women at Mannargudi, and the renovation of local waterbodies at a cost of Rs 43 crore. A detailed project report for a Nannilam bypass road would be prepared soon, and a statue of Nel Jayaraman will be erected at Thiruthuraiipoondi, he said.

Despite the state facing a financial crunch and the Centre withholding its rightful share of funds, CM Stalin asserted that his government continues to push forward with development projects. Taking a swipe at Palaniswami, he said, "How can you save Tamil Nadu when you cannot even save the AIADMK from the BJP? Earlier you were the dubbing artist for the BJP; now you've become its full-time spokesperson."

Responding to EPS' criticism of the Hindu Religious and Charitable Endowments (HR&CE) Department building educational institutions, CM Stalin said.

## India's best 'off-shore airport' to be built in Mumbai: Devendra Fadnavis

Mumbai, June 9 (GNS) Maharashtra Chief Minister Devendra Fadnavis on Friday claimed that the country's best 'off-shore airport' will be built in Mumbai, which will be the third airport in Mumbai. "The work on this will start soon. Currently, the state has airport and runway facilities in 24 districts, and these facilities are being expanded to 30 districts in the coming period," he claimed while speaking at the 'Western Region Ministers Conference' organised by the Union Ministry of Civil Aviation.

The Chief Minister said that India is the fastest-growing economy in the world, adding that there is a great need for a robust aviation ecosystem that will lead India towards development. "Till a few years ago,



aviation was a matter only for the Centre, but now the situation has changed. This issue is becoming important as states which do not give priority to aviation will lag behind in progress. We are creating all the facilities that complement green field and ground field aviation in the state. There is a great need for manpower for this," he said. He pointed out that

soon India will become the third-largest economy in the world, and aviation will have a big share in this progress, adding that currently, 24 districts in the state have airport and runway facilities.

"These facilities will be expanded to 30 districts in the coming period. The runways are being upgraded. The airport and night landing facilities attract a large number of

entrepreneurs and investors. A proposal has been submitted to the central government to build a new airport in a remote district like Gadchiroli. An investment of Rs 1.5 lakh crore will be made in Gadchiroli, which is expected to increase to Rs 10 lakh crore," he claimed.

The Chief Minister said that the work on the Navi Mumbai Airport started in the 1990s, adding that this work required various permissions.

He added that it took fifteen years to get these various permissions, seven of which were granted by Prime Minister Narendra Modi at once. "We are starting the Navi Mumbai Airport soon. This airport and the Atal Setu will contribute a lot to progress.

## Mirwaiz placed under house arrest in J&K's Srinagar

Srinagar, June 9 (GNS) Senior religious leader Mirwaiz Umar Farooq said on Friday that the authorities have not allowed him to go to the Jama Masjid to deliver his weekly sermon.

"Disallowed to go to Jama Masjid today, put under house arrest, fearing the mention of the martyrs of 13th July 1931 in my Friday sermon! The sacrifice of these martyrs and all the martyrs since, is etched in the collective memory of Kashmir and can not be undone by restrictions and bans." He further said, "No living nation can forget the supreme sacrifice of life of its martyrs against tyranny and injustice. It is my appeal to the authorities to remove the restrictions and allow people to

peacefully pay homage to the martyrs of 13th July. Inshallah if allowed as per our tradition, we will visit the martyrs graveyard on July 13th after Zuhr prayers and pay homage to the revered martyrs", Mirwaiz Umar said on X.

Mirwaiz Umar was referring to July 13, which was observed as 'Martyrs' Day' in J&K before the abrogation of Article 370. It was a day to remember the death of protesters who stormed the Srinagar central jail on this day in 1931 against the in camera trial of Abul Qadeer, a Pathan butler of a British officer, who had delivered a speech asking people to rise against the autocratic rule of Dogra Maharaja Hari Singh.

# Drip Irrigation Can Transform Indian Agriculture, Boost Productivity and Exports

New Delhi, June 9 (GNS) Union Minister of Commerce and Industry Piyush Goyal on Wednesday said that India's agriculture and fisheries exports have now reached Rs 4.5 lakh crore but they have the potential to grow to Rs 20 lakh crore, provided the country strengthens food processing and improves the quality of branding and packaging.

Addressing the 'ICC: Kri-shi Vikram Thematic Ses-sion', Goyal said that India's agricultural export basket is expanding with new commodities such as litchi, pineapple, bottle gourd, and jamun, which were not exported earlier, now reaching international markets.

He mentioned that jamun was recently exported to the UK, and litchis from Punjab were exported to Doha and Dubai. He added that India's footprint in global markets such as the UAE, Saudi Arabia, and other Gulf nations is steadily growing.



He also highlighted Prime Minister Narendra Modi's global push for millets through the International Year of Millets, which has brought global attention to India's traditional grains and their nutritional value.

The minister pointed out that when farmers, industries, and exporters work together, challenges are resolved more efficiently. He said government assis-

tance would be available for packaging and design support to scale up exports. Goyal underlined the need to build a resilient supply chain across agriculture, from seeds to fertilisers, insecticides, pesticides, and equipment such as water pumps. He said that India must be prepared for any global disruption in agricultural imports and ensure self-reliance across all as-

pects of farm inputs. The minister emphasised that drip irrigation can be a game changer for India's agriculture, particularly in rain-fed areas. He said that water conservation meth-ods like drip irrigation must be scaled up into a mass movement. By creating small water bodies at the village level and adopting drip irrigation widely, Indi-

an agriculture can become more predictable and less vulnerable to climate vari-ability. These steps will not only enhance productivity but also facilitate exports by improving crop reliabil-ity and consistency. He highlighted the ben-efits of replacing outdated water pumps with smaller, energy-efficient models. These smart pumps can be controlled remotely via mo-bile phones, provide data on water usage, and help farmers regulate irrigation. When integrated with drip systems, they can signifi-cantly reduce water wastage and damage caused by over-irrigation. He said energy-efficient pumps combined with drip irrigation could also bring down input costs and improve the overall sustainability of farming practices. By reducing elec-tricity usage and optimising water consumption, these technologies directly benefit farmers and enhance long-term productivity.

# Regulatory Easing to Strengthen Credit Growth

New Delhi, June 9 (GNS) Gross loan advances by non-banking financial companies (NBFCs) have grown significantly, doubling from Rs 24 lakh crore as of March 2021 to Rs 48 lakh crore as of March 2025, Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said.

Addressing the 'NBFC Symposium 2025' here, she said NBFCs have emerged as an important source of credit for segments that have historically been under-served or excluded. "The NBFC ecosystem has over 9,000 registered entities, which range from large in-frastructure lenders to niche players in microfinance and asset-backed lending. To-gether, they fulfil a range of credit needs and are the first point of contact for crores of citizens and small business-ees seeking financial empow-erment," the Finance Minis-ter told the gathering.

Recent regulatory mea-sures such as the restora-



tion of risk weights on bank lending and the easing of financial conditions are ex-pected to further improve credit prospects, strength-ening the overall funding environment for the sector.

"With the recent RBI mea-sures reducing the costs of funds to the sector, I urge NBFCs to pass on the ben-efits of this reduction onto customers. The government remains committed to sup-porting the NBFC sector by enabling a responsive policy environment," she stated.

The Finance Minister fur-ther said she wants to assure the industry that "we are

committed to a consulta-tive approach, and the is-sues flagged in the consul-tations with NBFCs will be examined with due atten-tion". "Deep collaboration between NBFCs and banks, especially through co-lend-ing arrangements, needs to be there. Such partnerships should be institutionalised and scaled. A seamless digital co-lending architec-ture, common onboarding standards, and interoper-able servicing platforms can greatly enhance credit flow to underserved sectors while ensuring risk-sharing and efficiency," she highlighted.

# Railways give 9,000 jobs in Q1; plans 50,000 for FY 2025-26

New Delhi, June 9 (GNS) Indian Railways has already handed out over 9,000 ap-pointment letters in the first quarter of the financial year 2025-26 (Q1 FY26), and is on track to offer more than 50,000 jobs by the end of this fiscal year, the Ministry of Railways announced.

The Railway Recruitment Boards (RRBs) have been actively conducting large-scale recruitment drives to fill various positions. Since November 2024, the RRBs have held Computer-Based Tests (CBTs) for over 1.86 crore candidates across the country for seven different recruitment notifications.

These notifications to-gether aim to fill 55,197 va-cancies, most of which will be appointed during the cur-rent financial year. Conduct-ing exams for such a large number of candidates is a massive task that requires detailed planning and coordi-nation. To make the pro-cess more convenient, RRBs have started allotting exam

centres closer to the candi-dates' homes.

Special priority is being given to female candidates and persons with benchmark disabilities (PwBDs) for local centres. This change has increased the need for more exam centres and staff, but is aimed at making the recruit-ment process more acces-sible and inclusive. To ensure transparency and fairness, RRBs have introduced Aadhaar-based e-KYC authen-tication for the first time in such large-scale exams.

This step has seen a high success rate of over 95 per cent in verifying candidates' identities. Additionally, to curb cheating and the use of unfair means, jammers are now being used in 100 per cent of the exam centres to block electronic communi-cation. The recruitment drive is not slowing down anytime soon. Following the annual calendar, twelve more noti-fications have already been issued since 2024, aiming to fill 1,08,324 vacancies.

# Sensex and Nifty open flat as market prepares for Q1 FY26 earnings season

Mumbai, June 9 (GNS) The Indian benchmark indices opened flat on Thursday amid mixed global cues as selling was seen in the auto and IT sectors in the early trade. At around 9.29 am, Sensex was trading 40.96 points or 0.05 per cent down at 83,495.12 while the Nifty declined 17.70 points or 0.07 per cent at 25,458.40. Nifty Bank was up 29.50 points or 0.05 per cent at 57,243.05 in early trade. The Nifty Midcap 100 index was trading at 59,448 after adding 108.40 points or 0.18 per cent. Nifty Smallcap 100 index was at 19,057.75 after adding 50.35 points or 0.26 per cent. According to analysts, with trade and tariff news feeling more routine these days, the market is bracing for the start of earnings season. "The big banks, in-cluding JPMorgan Chase, Citigroup, and Wells Fargo, start reporting next Tues-day. As of now, analysts ex-pect 5.8 per cent earnings



growth for the S&P 500 in the second quarter," said Vikram Kasat, Head-Advisory, PL Capital.

Expectations from the IT sector are limited. How-ever, midcap IT is likely to post good results and positive commentary, said experts. "Banks, despite strong balance sheets and abundant liquidity, are struggling with low credit growth. Outperformers in the banking segment will be those who post good credit growth. In autos, M&M and Eicher have

the potential to outper-form," they added.

Meanwhile, in the Sensex pack, Tata Steel, Axis Bank, Power Grid, Bajaj Finance, M&M, ICICI Bank and Titan were the top gainers. Whereas, Tata Motors, In-fosys, Sun Pharma, Bharti Airtel, TCS, Asian Paints, NTPC and HDFC Bank were the top losers.

On the institutional front, foreign institutional investors (FIIs) were net buyers of equities worth Rs 77 crore on July 9, while domestic institutional in-

vestors (DIIs) were also net buyers, investing Rs 920 crore on the same day.

In the Asian markets, Hong Kong, Seoul, China and Jakarta were trading in green and only Japan was trading in red. In the last trading session, Dow Jones in the US closed at 44,458.30, up 217.54 points, or 0.49 per cent. The S&P 500 ended with a gain of 37.74 points, or 0.61 per cent at 6,263.26 and the Nasdaq closed at 20,611.34, up 192.87 points, or 0.94 per cent.

# India and OPEC have a unique & symbiotic relationship: Puri

Vienna, June 9 (GNS) Union Minister of Petroleum and Natural Gas, Hardeep Singh Puri, has emphasised India's strong partnership with OPEC, discussing ways to ensure that oil markets remain balanced to ensure smooth global transition into green and alternative energies. Puri met OPEC Secretary General Haitham Al-Ghais at the 9th OPEC International Seminar here.

"We discussed India's strong partnership with OPEC and ways to ensure that oil markets remain bal-anced and predictable to ensure smooth global tran-sition into green and alter-native energies particularly in the light of recent geo-political challenges," said Union Minister in a post on X social media platform.

India, as world's third largest importer of oil, and OPEC, the grouping of major oil producers, have a unique and symbiotic relationship, he mentioned. During his

address at the event, Puri said even as India's efforts to achieve energy security con-tinue to gain momentum, "we continue to implement programs to fulfil energy needs of our citizens". "More than 103 million LPG con-nections have been provid-ed to women from economi-cally weaker households as a part of Prime Minister's visionary Pradhan Man-tri Ujjwala Yojana (PMUY) which is the world's largest clean cooking programme," he told the gathering.

"India is a powerhouse of tech talent and a key player in the global innovation ecosystem, supported by availability of skilled talent and employment opportuni-ties across Tier I as well as emerging cities of the coun-try," said Arpit Mehrotra, Managing Director, Office Services, India, Colliers.

adding tech cities in India account for 69 per cent of the total tech talent in the Asia Pacific region. Bena-



luru and Hyderabad, which host the region's largest tal-ent clusters, continue to lead tech leasing activity, togeth-er driving nearly 50 per cent of the conventional office space uptake in H1 2025.

"With the availability of high-quality office space, robust IT infrastructure, and cost competitiveness, India's office markets will contin-ue to feature prominently among the top destinations for technology-led global economic expansion," Meh-

rotra added. The report ex-aminated more than 200 glob-al markets based on their talent acquisition, venture capital (VC) funding, labour index, talent pipeline and sector composition.

India ranks among the top destinations for tech talent both in the Asia Pacific as well as globally. Bengaluru and Hyderabad continue to remain preferred tech destinations in India, fol-lowed closely by other major markets, all of which attract

global tech companies with skilled talent availability and a mature tech ecosystem, the report found.

Occupiers in the technol-ogy sector remain a cor-nerstone of office space demand across India's top seven cities, driving Grade A space uptake in both con-ventional and flex spaces over the past years. Dur-ing H1 2025, tech occupiers leased over 10 million square feet of office space across the top seven cities, driving 40 per cent of the conventional space demand. Within flex spaces too, nearly half of the demand came from technol-ogy firms. Global Capability Centres (GCCs) particularly those in the technology space - continue to drive India's commercial real estate momentum. With a strong focus on innovation, scal-ability, and cost efficiency, India has firmly established itself as a global hub for GCC expansion, especially across its top office markets.

# Shipping and waterways sector will play a key role in boosting exports: Minister

New Delhi, June 9 (GNS) Shipping and waterways will play a vital role in enhancing India's exports as the coun-try is headed to become the third largest economic pow-er, Minister of State for Ports, Shipping and Waterways, Shantanu Thakur, said.

Addressing a conference on exports logistics organ-ised by the Confederation of Indian Industry (CII) here, the minister emphasised that equal and balanced fo-cus on development of each sector is crucial.

Thakur highlighted that reduction of the turnaround time of ships in the trans-shipment of goods is of paramount importance. "As 70 per cent of trade happens through shipping, there is a need for vast development of the shipping industry," Thakur pointed out.

He also said that the use of artificial intelligence is an imperative for deeper devel-opment of the shipping and logistics sector. The minister



mentioned the need for im-proved communication to establish a robust connectiv-ity infrastructure, spanning from the Northeast region to the Northwest part of India, encompassing both first mile and last-mile connections. Speaking at the conference, Rajesh Agrawal, Special Sec-etary, Department of Com-merce, highlighted three important factors in India's logistics journey. First, the container revolution played an important role in enhanc-ing the role of Global Value Chains (GVC).

He further emphasised the significance of India's ongoing and past free trade agreement (FTA) negotia-tions in enhancing India's participation in GVCs, add-ing that identification of gaps in multimodal trans-shipment and bringing all stakeholders together will bring down the logistics cost, driving exports and growth in India's economy.

Secondly, Agrawal men-tioned that there is a need for more air cargo space, port space, rail and road space, in addition to en-

hancing cold chain logis-tics in India's agriculture sector.

He further highlighted that to achieve Net Zero by 2027, there is a need to see that the logistics journey that India embarks upon is sustainable, with minimum carbon footprint. Vijay Ku-mar, Chairman, Inland Waterways Authority, deliberat-ed on India's transformative journey and the role of In-land Waterways in actualis-ing India's ambitious goal of achieving \$2 trillion in ex-ports by 2030, and net zero emission target by 2070.

## 90% of the Votes, But Who Gets the Share of Power? A Serious Question to RJD's Politics

The recent nomination for the Bihar Legislative Council (MLC) has once again raised an important debate about political representation and social justice. For decades, a significant section of Bihar's Muslim community has stood firmly with the Rashtriya Janata Dal (RJD), considering it a political force committed to protecting the interests of minorities, backward classes, and marginalized communities. However, many Muslims today are asking a difficult question: If Muslims contribute substantially to the party's electoral strength, why is their representation in positions of power often limited?

The concern is not merely about one seat or one nomination. It is about the larger issue of political participation and equitable representation. When communities consistently support a political party but do not see themselves adequately represented in legislative bodies, organizational leadership, or decision-making positions, feelings of disappointment and alienation naturally emerge.

Particularly among Pasmanda Muslims, there is a growing perception that while their votes are welcomed during elections, their aspirations for leadership and representation are often overlooked. So-



cial justice cannot be measured only through slogans and speeches; it must be reflected in ticket distribution, appointments, and power-sharing. A democratic system thrives when every community feels that its voice matters. Political parties must recognize that Muslims, especially the Pasmanda sections, are not merely vote banks but stakeholders in the democratic process. Their participation should be visible not only at the polling booth but also in legislative councils, assemblies, and party structures.

The question being raised today is simple: Will political loyalty continue to be rewarded only with promises, or will it also translate into meaningful representation? This is not just a question for one political party. It is a question for the entire democratic system of Bihar and India.

## Traffic rules are not optional, says SI as Police Book Violators

Hyderabad, June 9 (GNS) Number plate less vehicles targeted in special drive; motorists advised to follow safety regulations

Narayanpet: The Traffic Police in Narayanpet district conducted a special enforcement drive against vehicles operating without number plates and took action against motorists found violating traffic regulations. During the drive, officials identified 12 vehicles being driven without number plates on public roads. Fines were imposed on the violators, and vehicle owners were instructed to immediately install proper registration plates in accordance with the law. Speaking on the occa-

sion, Traffic Sub-Inspector Krishna Chaitanya stated that driving vehicles without number plates is a violation of the law. He emphasized that number plates play a crucial role in vehicle identification, traffic management, and criminal investigations. He noted that some motorists continue to ignore traffic regulations by operating vehicles without registration plates and warned that strict action would be taken against such offenders under the Motor Vehicles Act. The SI further explained that the absence of number plates makes it difficult for authorities to identify vehicles involved in thefts, accidents, or other offenses.

## Telangana ACB conducts searches at R&B Engineer-in-Chief's premises

Hyderabad, June 9 (GNS) The Telangana Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB) conducted searches at the residence and other premises linked to Roads and Buildings (R&B) Engineer-in-Chief Mohan Naik and his relatives on Tuesday. Simultaneous searches at various locations are in connection with allegations that he amassed assets disproportionate to his known sources of income.

Apart from Naik's residence at Madhapur, the ACB teams were conduct-

ing searches at 15 other locations linked to him and his relatives. Officials were examining documents and financial and property details recovered during the searches. There have been allegations that the Engineer-in-Chief favoured certain companies in awarding contracts and building a large network of influence across Telangana.

The officials recovered Rs 60 lakh cash, gold jewellery weighing a kilogram, and 13 gold biscuits. They



also found documents of properties in Hyderabad and Nizamabad. The ACB officials were compiling details of movable and immovable assets found during the

searches. It is likely to come out with an official statement later. This comes less than a week after ACB arrested suspended ASP Nayani Bhujanga Rao in a dis-

proportionate assets case. He was produced before a court, which sent him to judicial custody for 14 days.

The ACB had conducted searches at two of the residences of the police officer. Simultaneous searches were also carried out at 15 locations linked to his relatives and associates across Nalgonda, Suryapet, and Sangareddy districts. Officials said they unearthed movable and immovable assets worth approximately Rs 5.92 crore based on registration

value. The market value of immovable properties may be many times higher than the document value.

Rao, one of the accused in the illegal phone-tapping case, was arrested in 2024 and was later released on bail. On May 19, the ACB registered a case of disproportionate assets against a top official of Hyderabad Metro Water Supply and Sewerage Board here on Tuesday after assets of over Rs 5.88 crore were found during searches at premises linked to him.

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
