People Have Understood Importance Of Political Stability, Decisiveness Of Stable Govt: PM Modi



NEW DELHI, Jun 10 (GNS): As he became India's longest continuously serving elected prime minister, Narendra Modi on Wednesday said people of the country have now understood the importance of political stability and the decisiveness of a stable government.

Modi also said the dream of a 'Viksit Bharat' does

not belong to a person or party, but has become the resolve of every person in the country. "For me, people represent God," he said at an NDA conclave here. "People of the country have understood the importance of political stability at the national level. It is their maturity that they gave me an opportunity to

serve them for such a long time," Modi said.

"Many decades before 2014 were full of instability and upheavals but people are now witnessing the work of a stable government and are admiring its decisiveness," he added.

Modi also said a big success of 12 years of NDA rule was that it freed the

country from the Congress' "vicious trap". "When the NDA won in 2014, I had said today there is a dawn of a new hope for the common person. After Congress' betrayal, people showed confidence in us. As an NDA family, we have strengthened the confidence that people have on us," Modi said.

Centre Must Explain Rising LPG, Fuel Prices: Gogoi

Guwahati, Jun 10 (GNS): Congress MP Gaurav Gogoi on Wednesday attacked the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)-led Centre over rising prices and economic concerns, alleging that the government was avoiding questions on inflation while attempting to divert public attention to other issues. Speaking to reporters, Gogoi said people across the country were increasingly worried about their economic future and the rising cost of living. He argued that concerns about inflation, fuel prices, and household expenses were dominating public discussions.

According to the Congress leader, Prime Minister Narendra Modi should



provide a clear explanation on issues affecting ordinary citizens, particularly the prices of LPG cylinders and petroleum products.

"People are facing economic stress and uncertainty. The government should tell citizens when LPG prices will come down, when petrol prices will be reduced and what concrete measures are being taken to control inflation," Gogoi said. He claimed that public anxiety over economic con-

ditions had increased and that the Centre had failed to offer convincing answers on key livelihood issues. The Congress MP also referred to concerns over the value of the Indian currency and developments in the global economy, saying citizens expected greater clarity from the government.

Gogoi alleged that instead of directly addressing these concerns, the BJP was focusing on creating distractions and shifting

public discourse away from bread-and-butter issues. He accused the ruling party of attempting to create confusion among the public and diverting media attention from pressing economic challenges.

"The issues people are discussing today are inflation, employment, household expenditure and financial security. These are the questions the government must answer," he said. The Congress leader further alleged that the BJP was prioritising political narratives over governance and economic management. He maintained that the opposition would continue to raise issues related to price rises and the economic hardships faced by common citizens.

Shivakumar Meets Sonia, Rahul & Priyanka Gandhi



New Delhi, June 10 (GNS): Karnataka Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar on Wednesday met senior Congress leaders Sonia Gandhi, Leader of the Opposition (LoP) in Lok Sabha Rahul

Gandhi and Priyanka Gandhi Vadra at Sonia Gandhi's residence, 10 Janpath, in New Delhi. This was his first visit to 10 Janpath after assuming the role of Chief Minister. During the meeting, Shivakumar expressed his gratitude to the Congress leadership and discussed various party- and governance-related matters.

The Chief Minister called on Congress Parliamentary Party Chairperson Sonia Gandhi, LoP Rahul Gandhi, and AICC General

Secretary Priyanka Gandhi Vadra during his visit to the national capital. Shivakumar thanked the Congress leadership for its continued support and guidance.

Sources said the meeting also involved consultations on organisational and political issues concerning Karnataka and the party's future plans.

Earlier, Karnataka Chief Minister D.K. Shivakumar paid a courtesy visit to the National Mahila Congress office in New Delhi. National Mahila Congress President Alka Lamba, General Secretaries Kamalakshi Rajanna and Shilpi Arora, along with other office-bearers, were present during the visit.

India UAE partnership deepens economic ties, boosts energy and logistics cooperation

New Delhi, June 10 (GNS): India-UAE relationship is driven by economic pragmatism and mutual investment opportunities, allowing both countries to pursue shared economic objectives while retaining flexibility in wider foreign policy ties, a new report has said.

The report from Times Kuwait said India and the United Arab Emirates are deepening a sector focused partnership that prioritises trade, energy security, logis-

tics and technology cooperation. The partnership has gained momentum through initiatives such as the India Middle East Europe Corridor (IMEC) and expanded energy cooperation.

In May 2026, New Delhi and Abu Dhabi signed a strategic partnership agreement to deepen collaboration in advanced technology, innovation, industrial development, maritime security and information exchange. "The agreement



is expected to create new opportunities for collaboration in high-value sectors, support technology transfer and enhance the capabilities of both coun-

tries in areas critical to future economic growth," the report forecasted. Though not structured as a formal alliance in the traditional sense, the new framework indicates growing interest in creating integrated economic corridors and strengthening commercial linkages across multiple regions. UAE's Fujairah energy hub is a strategic asset for India due to its unique location, offering petroleum storage outside the Strait of

Hormuz and helping diversify India's energy logistics and storage options.

"The arrangement strengthens India's energy security by diversifying storage options and improving supply-chain resilience during periods of market volatility or geopolitical uncertainty," the report said.

The Middle East occupies a key position in India's economic outlook, due to it being a vital source of energy supplies, investment

and acting as a trade connectivity hub. The region also hosts a large Indian expatriate community that contributes significantly to bilateral economic ties.

The partnership also complements broader regional frameworks such as I2U2 — India, the UAE, Israel and the United States — which aims to promote cooperation in technology, infrastructure, logistics, food security and investment.

Defence Ministry inks rs 449 crore deal to buy hi-tech satellite system jammers for navy

New Delhi, June 10 (GNS): The Ministry of Defence on Wednesday signed a contract with Accord Software and Systems Private Limited (ASSPL), Bengaluru, for the procurement of 20 enhanced capability global navigation satellite system (ECGNSS) jammers for the Indian Navy at a total cost of Rs 449 crore, with the product will have a minimum 75 per cent indigenous content, an official statement said.

The system's capabilities include degrading the satellite signal acquisition and



tracking performance of the adversary GNSS receiver and signal spoofing or deceptive jamming. The induction would pave the way for safe operations by the ships of the Indian Navy in a multi-

threat environment, as per the ministry statement. The contract, under the Buy (Indian-Indigenously Designed, Developed and Manufactured) category, was inked here in the pres-

ence of Defence Secretary Rajesh Kumar Singh.

"The contract reinforces the government's commitment to Atmanirbhar Bharat and Make-in-India while bolstering the maritime security architecture of the country. It marks a critical milestone in the ongoing efforts to bolster defence capabilities and indigenise advanced military technology," the statement said. During the last decade, India has transitioned from being a major importer of defence equipment to an emerging exporter.

PM must fulfil J&K statehood promise: Farooq Abdullah

Srinagar, June 10 (GNS): National Conference President and former Chief Minister Dr Farooq Abdullah on Wednesday said that Prime Minister Narendra Modi must honour his commitment on J&K statehood. Addressing party workers here today, Dr Abdullah said Chief Minister Omar Abdullah has repeatedly raised the issue with Prime Minister Modi and expressed hope that Jammu and Kashmir would regain statehood at the earliest.

Dr Abdullah said the Chief Minister had taken up the matter with the Prime Minister on several occasions and received assurances regarding the restoration of statehood.

He said the demand for restoration of statehood remains a central issue for the people of Jammu and Kashmir and expressed confidence that the commitment made by the country's leadership would eventually be fulfilled. "Omar Abdullah has taken up the issue of statehood with the Prime Minister, who assured him that it will be restored," Dr Abdullah said.

The National Conference President asserted that Prime Minister Modi had publicly committed to restoring statehood and said the promise was



made before the entire nation and the international community. Dr Abdullah said the people of Jammu and Kashmir continue to look forward to the restoration of statehood and hoped that the process would be completed without further delay.

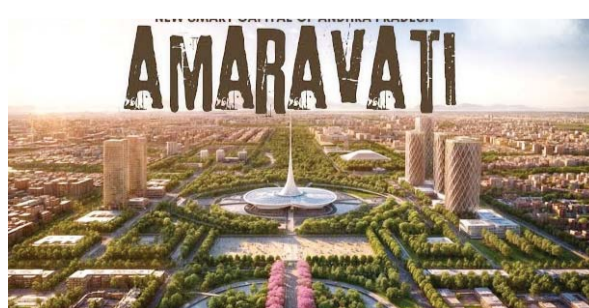
NC legislators have decided to stage a protest for the restoration of statehood and constitutional guarantees to J&K at the Jantar Mantar in Delhi on the first day of the Parliament's Monsoon session.

Omar Abdullah has also requested the opposition Peoples Democratic Party (PDP), the Congress and other like-minded political parties to join the protest. Estranged NC leader and MP, Aga Syed Ruhullah Mehdi, has announced that he would join the protest, but asserted that restoration of Article 370 must remain the main demand of the NC.

Cabinet approves rs 1,235 crore housing project in Andhra's new Capital Amaravati

New Delhi, June 10 (GNS): The Cabinet Committee on Economic Affairs, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, on Wednesday approved the construction of the general pool residential accommodation at Andhra Pradesh's new capital city, Amaravati, with an investment of Rs 1,234.91 crores.

"The project will be funded by the Government of India through budgetary support under the Head of Account: 4216 - Capital Outlay on Housing (Residential Buildings)," a Cabinet communique said.



The project will be executed by the Ministry of Housing & Urban Affairs through the Central Public Works Department (CPWD). Pre-bid activities have already commenced, and the preparation of tender documents is presently in progress, it

added. The objective of the proposal is to alleviate the financial burden on Central government employees by providing adequate residential accommodation, thereby enhancing their morale, promoting integrity, and contributing to their overall

well-being. Further, by enabling staff to reside in close proximity to their workplaces, the project will support efficient government functioning and ensure that employees remain readily available to discharge their official duties effectively, the communique said. The General Pool Residential Accommodation (GPRA) Campus in Amaravati is planned over an area of 17 acres. The development comprises 11 residential towers with a total of 1,504 dwelling units, ranging from Type II to Type VI, including refuge areas.

Dr Jitendra Singh bats for holistic healthcare, calls for restoring doctor-patient trust

New Delhi, June 10 (GNS) Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh on Sunday urged the medical fraternity to reclaim the dignity, integrity, and social faith that once defined the noble profession, while emphasising that the changing perception of doctors stems not from individual failings alone but from larger shifts in societal values. Paying rich tribute to Dr Bidhan Chandra Roy, the world-renowned physician and doyen of medical academics, Dr Singh invoked his legacy to emphasise the importance of restoring doctor-patient trust which was the hall-



mark of Dr Roy's era in the first half of the 20th century. Speaking at the Doctors' Day celebration organised by the national body of the Indian Medical Association (IMA) here, the minister said "One of the greatest traits of Dr. Roy was the unwavering

trust he and his contemporaries commanded in society, without compromising his consultation fee or ethics". "Dr. Roy charged a consultation fee of over Rs 66 in the 1940s, and nobody questioned it. Today, we must ask ourselves — why

has the same trust eroded?" he asked. Recalling the legacy of the Indian Medical Association (IMA), the minister described it as a "pillar of Indian healthcare," and lauded it as the largest and oldest body of medical practitioners in the country.

Founded in 1928 during the 5th All India Medical Conference in Calcutta, IMA stands today as a formidable national force representing over 3.3 lakh doctors through 1,750+ local branches across 34 states and Union Territories. With its headquarters in Delhi, the IMA has remained at the forefront of shaping healthcare policy, strengthening medical ethics, and promoting public health awareness.

The minister highlighted the shift from a time dominated by infectious diseases to a present-day dual burden of communicable and non-communicable diseases,

creating both challenges and opportunities for Indian doctors and researchers. "You name the disease — we have it in India. That's why global researchers increasingly look to India," he said.

Dr Singh also spoke about the paradox of India's demographic profile. "We are a young country with over 70 per cent of the population under 42, yet at the same time, we are ageing rapidly. Life expectancy has increased from 50 years in the 1950s to over 70 years today. This shift calls for a new curriculum, a new mindset, and a new model of medical practice," he noted.

Construction of 13,000 ultra-modern stadiums to start soon, says Punjab CM

Chandigarh, June 10 (GNS) Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann on Sunday announced that the government will soon commence the construction of 13,000 ultra-modern stadiums across the state, with work on 3,083 already underway in the first phase. Addressing the media here, the Chief Minister said the government is focusing on promoting sports to positively channel the immense energy of the youth. He emphasised the aim is to instil a sporting culture in the state and steer young people away from the scourge of drug addiction.

Mann said these stadiums will be instrumental in the

promotion of sporting spirit across the state, especially at the village level. The Chief Minister criticised previous governments, stating that successive Congress and Akali-BJP regimes paid no attention to the development of sports infrastructure or youth employment.

As a result, he lamented, drugs spread unchecked across the state, and the youth sank deeper into addiction. However, Mann highlighted that the state is now witnessing a transformation, thanks to the on-going anti-drug campaign, Yudh Nasheyana De Virudh, launched by the government.

Delhi Speaker apprises V-P Jagdeep Dhankhar on Assembly's modernisation

New Delhi, June 10 (GNS) Delhi Assembly Speaker Vijender Gupta on Sunday apprised Vice President Jagdeep Dhankhar of the initiatives undertaken to modernise the functioning of the legislature. Speaker Gupta met Dhankhar at the Vice President's House and also presented a special booklet titled '100 Days of the 8th Delhi Legislative Assembly – Marching Ahead with Legacy and Development'.



ambitious move towards a paperless environment is designed to enhance legislative transparency, improve operational efficiency, and facilitate real-time communication among Members, he said.

Gupta also highlighted the commissioning of a 500 kW Solar Power Project at the Assembly premises.

With this initiative, the entire complex is poised to operate entirely on renewable energy, marking a significant move towards environmental sustainability. The project aligns with national goals of energy conservation and sets a commendable precedent for green public infrastructure, he said.

Mayawati reviews BSP's expansion in seven states

Lucknow, June 10 (GNS) Bahujan Samaj Party (BSP) National President and former Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Mayawati on Sunday discussed measures to strengthen party organisation in seven states -- Maharashtra, Gujarat, Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu and Kerala.

She also expressed concern over the growing religious frenzy and violence over language and caste issues, demanding protection for residents of other states working in the financial capital, Mumbai.

Referring to the recent violence against non-Marathi speakers in Mumbai, May-

awati called upon the state and Central governments to provide security to all.

"Mumbai is the financial capital of the country, and people from all states have a link with it," she said.

Referring to the language row, Mayawati said that such dangerous tendencies are rooted in the narrow politics of religion, region, caste and language that try to overshadow patriotism and love for the country.

The BSP chief also urged state governments to pay special attention to important issues of public interest like inflation, poverty, unemployment, illiteracy and health, along with law and order.

Tejashwi alleges irregularities in Bihar's voter list revision, slams EC and BJP

Patna, June 10 (GNS) As the voter list revision process intensifies ahead of the upcoming Bihar Assembly elections, Leader of Opposition (LoP) and Rashtriya Janata Dal leader Tejashwi Yadav, on Sunday, launched a sharp political attack on the Election Commission, alleging serious irregularities in the ongoing Special Intensive Revision (SIR).

While talking to the media persons in Patna, he claimed that the voter list revision forms are lying scattered in various places across the state, including on flyovers and even with a jalebi seller in Deoghar, referencing a newspaper



report. He also alleged that voter list revision forms were found thrown at the Gandhi Maidan in Patna, sharing related videos and clips on social media to support his claims. Tejashwi accused the Election Commission of "planting news quoting unnamed sources to cover up its failures," calling such sources "urine," and adding, "Urine

means a waste material that spreads foul smell." He also said that these sources are those who claimed that Islamabad, Lahore and Karachi were captured during Operation Sindoor. "No amendment has been made so far, and the complaints of voters and opposition parties are being constantly ignored," Tejashwi said.

Northern Army Commander reviews operational preparedness of Bimber Gali Brigade in Poonch

New Delhi, June 10 (GNS) The General Officer Commanding-in-Chief of Northern Command, Lieutenant General Pratik Sharma, on Sunday visited the Army's Bimber Gali Brigade in Jammu and Kashmir's Poonch to review "current operational dynamics and preparedness." He was accompanied by GOC White Night Corps Lieutenant General P. K. Mishra and GOC Ace of Spades Major General Kaushik Mukherjee.



ensure complete domination of operational space." "During the visit, the Northern Command Chief interacted with all ranks and motivated them to maintain high operational readiness, morale and professionalism in view of emerging challenges," it

added. Notably, on July 11, Lt Gen Pratik Sharma and Lt Gen P.K. Mishra visited the forward posts along the Pir Panjal Range to review the operational environment and assess counter-insurgency and counter-infiltration deployment. The visit focused on ground posture

and threat response mechanisms. Bimber Gali falls in the Poonch sector area, a region which has witnessed a spate of terror attacks in the last three years. A major ambush happened along with Bimber-Poonch route in April 2023 near Bhatta Durian Forest when five Rashtriya Rifles (RR) soldiers were killed after terrorist attacked their vehicles.

Similarly, apart from Poonch-Rajouri, Kishtwar, Basantgarh, Doda, and Udhampur have also witnessed terror attacks in the last few years. Once declared free from militancy, the Rajouri-Poonch region has become a hotbed for terrorists' hideouts.

No information about drone attack on ULFA-I camp: Assam CM

Guwahati, June 10 (GNS) Assam Chief Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma on Sunday asserted that the state police were not involved in any drone attack carried out at the camps of banned militant outfit ULFA-I. He perhaps also mentioned that even Army did not confirm any such attacks on the outlawed group. Addressing the media, Sarma refuted speculation about the state police's role in a reported incident, asserting, "Assam Police is not involved in this incident. There has been no strike from the soil of Assam." Emphasising the need for clarity, Sarma added, "We need more details on the matter. If such



an operation has indeed occurred, the Indian Army will issue an official statement. As of now, there has been no communication from the defence establishment."

The Chief Minister stated that the state government is closely tracking developments and expects further updates through official

channels by evening. The Indian Army has denied that it carried out drone attacks on the eastern headquarters of the banned United Liberation Front of Assam-Independent (ULFA-I) in Myanmar. The banned ULFA-I on Sunday claimed that its Eastern headquarters in Myanmar had been targeted by the Indian Army with drones in the early hours. The proscribed outfit in a press statement claimed that in these cross-border strikes, their 19 cadres have been killed and another 19 injured. However, in an official statement, the India Army has denied these claims.

CM Stalin expresses delight at Gingee Fort getting UNESCO World Heritage tag

Chennai, June 10 (GNS) Tamil Nadu Chief Minister M.K. Stalin expressed joy over the inclusion of Gingee Fort in the prestigious list of UNESCO World Heritage Sites. Taking to social media, CM Stalin wrote: "Delighted that #GingeeFort, famously known as the 'Troy of the East', has been inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site as part of the Maratha Military Landscapes of India. This majestic hill fortress now joins Tamil Nadu's proud list of #UNESCO sites including the Great Living Chola Temples, the monuments at Mamallapuram, the Nilgiri Mountain Railway and the Western Ghats. A proud moment for Tamil Nadu and its enduring cultural heritage."

Gingee Fort, located in Tamil Nadu's Villupuram district, was among the 12 historic forts that make up the Maratha Military Landscapes of India. It was officially inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site during the 47th session of the World Heritage Committee (WHC) being held in Paris. The recognition brings global acclaim to the site and is expected to boost international tourism to the region. The Maratha Military Landscapes include a total of 12 fort sites, 11 of which are located in Maharashtra, with Gingee Fort being the sole representative from Tamil Nadu. The nomination for the UNESCO tag was submitted for the 2024-25 cycle by the Government of India.

Delhi Minister Parvesh Verma checks Yamuna water quality in Palla area

New Delhi, June 10 (GNS) Delhi Water Minister Parvesh Verma on Sunday joined officials in an exercise for the collection of Yamuna water samples in the Palla area of north Delhi, an official said. "Today, Yamuna was inspected in the Palla area, from where it enters Delhi. The water level and coastal condition were assessed through a boat with departmental officials," said a statement issued by the Minister's office.



tal. The water in the Palla area is absolutely clear, but as soon as the Yamuna enters Delhi, its colour becomes dark and dirty, said an official. Talking about rainwater drainage, an official of the Irrigation and Flood Department said the Delhi government is on the roads

during the rainy season to ensure the smooth flow of rainwater. "By showing pictures of 3-4 places, the Aam Aadmi Party is trying to create a wrong impression as if the entire city is submerged. However, the situation is not such at every place," said the statement.

Kerala students to move Supreme Court over revised engineering rank list

Thiruvananthapuram, June 10 (GNS) With engineering admissions in Kerala mired in controversy, a group of aggrieved students following the Kerala state syllabus is set to approach the Supreme Court, challenging the revised rank list prepared on the basis of the old normalisation formula as directed by the Kerala High Court. The students, who had initially ranked high in the merit list, have seen dramatic drop in their positions and allege denial of equal justice in the admission process.

The student collective, which has been coordinating efforts via WhatsApp, is likely to file the petition in



the apex court by Monday. "We were waiting for a copy of the High Court order to initiate legal steps," said Ajas Muhammad, who leads the collective. "What we will highlight in court is the denial of equal justice. Students who were among the toppers have dropped by thousands of ranks." The revised rank list,

published by the Commissioner for Entrance Examinations following the High Court judgment, has caused widespread concern among students from the Kerala and ICSE syllabi. Many have reported losing marks due to the reintroduction of the old normalisation formula. Some students who se-

cured full marks in their Plus Two board exams reportedly lost up to 27 marks in the final normalised score. Complaints have also surfaced that students were not adequately informed about changes in subject weightages. The High Court had earlier quashed the previous rank list, which was prepared using a new normalisation formula, and directed that a fresh list be published in accordance with the February prospectus. Following this, the state government has announced that it will not challenge the judgment in the Supreme Court, prompting students to move independently.

Jitendra Singh Says Science & Technology Will Drive India's Rise To World's 3rd Largest Economy

New Delhi, June 10 (GNS) Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) for Science & Technology, Earth Sciences, MoS PMO, Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions, Atomic Energy and Space, Dr. Jitendra Singh unveiled the 'NITI Aayog's Roadmap for Strengthening State Science and Technology Councils' at NITI Aayog complex, here today. The roadmap is a major step toward building a robust and coordinated science and technology ecosystem across the States to fuel India's transformation into a knowledge-driven economy. Delivering the keynote address, Dr. Jitendra Singh identified Science and Technology as the key growth engine of India's economic rise, stating that "if India is to move from the 4th to the 3rd largest economy and beyond, it is science and technology that will drive this growth." The Minister recalled that it was Prime

Minister Shri Narendra Modi who overhauled the planning framework in 2014, replacing the Planning Commission with NITI Aayog as a forward-looking think tank, which has since guided India's growth with visionary policies. "This transformation enabled long-term thinking, evidence-based policy, and a shift from fund allocation to strategic coordination," he emphasized. Dr. Jitendra Singh highlighted the successful coupling of States and Centre as a case study to harness the full potential of regional scientific talent. He urged State S&T Councils to act as intermediaries between research labs and communities, enabling grassroots-level impact of scientific innovation. He called upon the states to align their scientific vision with the national roadmap of Viksit Bharat @2047, and promote early industry linkages to ensure startup sustainability, not merely



through knowledge partnerships, but also through investment partnerships. Tracing India's exceptional S&T trajectory over the past decade, Dr. Jitendra Singh said PM Modi has consistently given patronage to scientific progress. "In each of his Independence Day addresses from the Red Fort in the last 11 years, he has

highlighted major scientific initiatives—be it the Swachh Bharat Mission, Digital India, Stand-Up and Start-Up India, Deep Ocean Mission, or the Digital Health Card," Dr. Singh noted. He emphasized that a change in mindset is critical for innovation. "We must move away from excessive reliance on government

funding and encourage vibrant public-private partnerships to unlock innovation at scale," he stated. Citing India's Science & Technology success stories like Chandrayaan-3, indigenous vaccine development and the successful gene therapy trial for Hemophilia published in The New England Journal of Medicine,

Dr. Jitendra Singh underscored India's rising global credibility. He highlighted that resident Indian patent filings have surged by nearly 56%, and 67% of India's research output now comes from centrally-funded institutions. The Minister described the recently established Anusandhan National Research Foundation

(ANRF) as a game-changer that will bridge gaps between academia, industry and government, facilitating co-creation and co-investment in research. He also praised the emerging Bio-E3 cell ecosystem, backed by the Prime Minister, stating, "The next big revolution will be biotech-driven, and India is set to lead the world." Referring to the liberalization of space and nuclear sectors for private participation, Dr. Jitendra Singh said, "With these domains unlocked, only the sky is the limit for Indian science." He called for the Government to assume the role of facilitator rather than controller, encouraging innovation to thrive. Dr. Jitendra Singh also lauded NITI Aayog's Atal Tinkering Labs initiative, which has nurtured innovation at the school level, providing a strong foundation for India's next generation of scientists and entrepreneurs. Vice Chairman of NITI Aayog,

Shri Suman Bery, emphasized the urgent need for such a roadmap to ensure that State S&T Councils align their efforts with national development goals and drive innovation that is both inclusive and sustainable. NITI Aayog Member Dr. V.K. Saraswat observed that "sustainability must be embedded into the innovation process," and highlighted the importance of capacity building at the state level to achieve long-term scientific excellence. The event was graced by Dr. N. Kalaiselvi, Director General, CSIR and Secretary, DSIR; Dr. M. Ravichandran, Secretary, Ministry of Earth Sciences (MoES); Dr. Shivkumar Kalyanaraman, CEO, Anusandhan National Research Foundation (ANRF); along with senior officials from the Ministry of Science & Technology and its departments, and senior advisors to NITI Aayog, were also present during the launch ceremony.

NITI Aayog Organizes High-Level Workshop on Ease of Doing Business & Investment Promotion

New Delhi, June 10 (GNS) NITI Aayog today hosted a high-level Workshop on Ease of Doing Business and Investment Promotion in New Delhi, bringing together senior policymakers from the Centre and States to accelerate business reforms across India. The Workshop was held under the leadership of Shri Rajiv Gauba, Member, NITI Aayog and featured a Special Address by Shri B.V.R. Subrahmanyam, CEO, NITI Aayog. Senior officials from eight States participated physically, while officials from other States and Union Territories joined virtually. The event also saw participation from DPIIT, Department of Revenue, Ministry of MSME, and representatives of leading industry bodies including CII, FICCI, and FISME. Deliberations were held across seven core reform areas vital to investment facilitation and improving the ease of doing business at the



sub-national level. These included Decriminalisation of Laws; Deregulation and Compliance Burden Reduction; Business Reform Action Plan (BRAP) Implementation; Development of Industrial Infrastructure; Single Window Clearance Systems; Financial and Taxation Reforms; Investment Promotion Strategies. During the session on decriminalization and compliance reform, several States presented their ongoing initiatives stemming from the Jan Vishwas Act 1.0, high-

lighting efforts to decriminalize minor business-related offences at the State level. States also emphasized a shift toward enhancing the "Speed of Doing Business", with a focus on reducing the number of stages in the business lifecycle to enable faster, more seamless operations for enterprises. The discussion underscored the need to convert minor business offences into civil penalties, while also streamlining compliance mechanisms to reduce the burden on entrepre-

neurs. States shared examples of removing imprisonment clauses, adopting self-certification regimes, removal of licence renewal and simplifying regulatory touchpoints to encourage ease of compliance and build trust with businesses. There was also a strong emphasis on aligning State-level actions with the national Business Reform Action Plan (BRAP) framework, ensuring that reforms lead to measurable and comparable improvements. Industry representatives ad-

vocated for the enactment of a national-level legislation to harmonise decriminalization and compounding provisions, across States. They also suggested the introduction of a Trusted Taxpayers Programme for both direct and indirect taxes, to incentivize compliance and promote a more facilitative regulatory environment. The spirit of cooperation and consensus within the GST Council was widely appreciated during the discussions. Participants highlighted the gradual reduction of tax rates, particularly benefiting small companies—90% of whom have transitioned smoothly to the new regime. The rationalisation of TDS was also acknowledged as a significant step, with participants noting that such measures have contributed meaningfully to reducing litigation and enhancing tax certainty, thereby supporting the overall Ease of Doing Business agenda.

Hardeep Singh Puri Meets Global Leaders at 9th OPEC Seminar

New Delhi, June 10 (GNS) During his participation at the 9th OPEC International Seminar held in Vienna yesterday, Shri Hardeep Singh Puri, Minister of Petroleum and Natural Gas, held a series of important bilateral and business meetings aimed at deepening India's energy partnerships and supporting the country's growing energy needs. Puri met with His Excellency Tareq Sulaiman Al-Roumi, Kuwait Minister of Oil and Chairman of Kuwait Petroleum Corporation, where both sides discussed ways to further strengthen the existing association. Kuwait currently ranks as the 6th largest source of crude oil, 4th largest source of LPG, and stands as India's 8th largest hydrocarbon trade partner, highlighting the depth and strategic importance of this bilateral energy relationship. In a separate meeting, Shri Puri met His Excellency Sen. Heineken Lokpobiri, Nigerian



Minister of State for Petroleum Resources. This interaction followed their previous engagement at Davos in 2024. Indian companies have been consistent buyers of Nigerian crude, and the discussions focused on exploring avenues to further expand hydrocarbons trade between the two nations and reinforce the longstanding partnership. Additionally, Shri Puri held

a brief meeting with Mr. Wael Sawan, CEO of Shell, to discuss potential collaborations in light of India's ambitious exploration and production (E&P) plans. Under the leadership of Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi, India is set to explore nearly 2.5 lakh square kilometers in new offshore and onshore areas, marking one of the world's largest bidding rounds.

Telangana to Launch 'Indiramma Kutumba Bheema' Insurance Scheme for 1.15 Crore Families: Dy CM Bhatti

Hyderabad, June 10 (GNS) Telangana Deputy Chief Minister and Finance Minister Bhatti Vikramarka Mallu on Tuesday announced that the State Government would soon launch the "Indiramma Kutumba Bheema" scheme, providing insurance coverage of 5 lakh to 1.15 crore families irrespective of caste or religion.

The insurance cover would provide financial assistance in the event of accidental death and other tragedies, Bhatti said while addressing a public meeting after laying the foundation stone for power infrastructure development works worth 11 crore in Bhongir. Highlighting the Congress government's welfare agenda, the Deputy Chief Minister said the adminis-



tration was continuing to implement programmes under the "Indiramma Rajyam" framework despite carrying a debt burden of 8 lakh crore inherited from previous governments and spending 76,000 crore annually on debt servicing.

He alleged that opposition parties were spreading mis-

information against the government and maintained that the Congress was fulfilling promises made during its pre-election padayatra led by Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy and himself.

Bhatti also criticised the previous BRS government over its handling of the power sector, alleging that in-

adequate funding to power distribution companies had pushed them into debt despite promises of free electricity. The present government, he said, was spending 14,000 crore annually to provide free power to nearly 30 lakh agricultural pump sets while ensuring quality and uninterrupted electricity supply.

He claimed that while the previous administration struggled to meet a peak demand of 15,000 MW during 2023-24, the current government successfully handled a record peak demand of 18,546 MW in 2025-26 without disruptions. The Deputy Chief Minister urged the public not to be misled by what he termed false propaganda by opposition leaders. Referring to women-cent-

ric welfare measures, Bhatti said the government had provided free bus travel for women and extended interest-free loans worth 67,000 crore to women's self-help groups over the past two-and-a-half years.

He said the government aimed to provide interest-free loans totalling 1.25 lakh crore to women over five years and was encouraging self-help groups to purchase and operate buses through the Telangana State Road Transport Corporation (TSRTC). On housing, Bhatti said the government had sanctioned 4.5 lakh houses under the Indiramma Housing Scheme with an allocation of 22,500 crore, providing 5 lakh financial assistance to each eligible homeless poor family.

Telangana sets record with 75 LMT Yasangi paddy procurement: Uttam

Hyderabad, June 10 (GNS) Telangana Irrigation and Civil Supplies Minister N. Uttam Kumar Reddy on Tuesday said Telangana had created a record in paddy procurement by purchasing over 75 lakh metric tonnes (LMT) of paddy during the current Yasangi season, despite the Centre fixing a target of only 52 LMT for the State.

Addressing a press conference at the Dr B R Ambedkar Secretariat along with Ministers Adhuri Lakshman and Vakiti Srihari, Uttam Kumar Reddy said Telangana alone accounted for over 61 percent of India's total Yasangi paddy procurement.

He said the State government spent an additional Rs 6,650 crore during the cur-



rent Rabi season to ensure that farmers received Minimum Support Price (MSP) for every grain brought to procurement centres.

The Minister said total Kharif and Rabi procurement during the current KMS 2025-26 season had crossed 147 LMT, making it the highest-ever paddy procurement in the history of Telangana and even combined Andhra Pradesh.

He stated that the government had directly credited around Rs 35,077 crore into the bank accounts of 25.20 lakh farmers towards procurement payments.

Criticising the BJP-led Central Government, Uttam Kumar Reddy alleged that the Centre had reduced Telangana's procurement target despite rising paddy production in the State. He demanded that the Centre procure the entire Yasangi paddy purchased by Telangana under the MSP policy.

The Minister said 8,575 procurement centres were operated across the State during the Yasangi season and assured farmers that the centres would remain open for another week to ten days to ensure procurement of every grain.

Women's progress is Telangana's progress: Minister Seethakka

Hyderabad, June 10 (GNS) Telangana Panchayat Raj and Rural Development Minister Danasari Anasuya Seethakka on Wednesday said the progress of women is the progress of society and asserted that the State Government is implementing several programmes aimed at ensuring economic empowerment and financial security for women.

Participating in a programme at Gandhi Bhavan for the distribution of sewing machine training certificates to 3,000 women from the Bhuvanagiri Parliamentary constituency, the Minister said Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy was moving forward with the vision that women's advancement would lead to the development of Telangana. The programme was organised by the Mother Education and Rural Development Society, led by Bojja Sandhya Reddy. Seethakka said women aged between 15 years and above 60 years could join women's self-help groups and assured that sewing machines would be provided to those who completed the training. She said women interested in setting up shops would be provided loans ranging from Rs 1 lakh to Rs 2 lakh and additional financial assistance would be extended for expanding businesses and purchasing more machines.

"We can create opportunities, but women should



come forward to establish businesses and grow independently," she said.

The Minister stated that the government had so far extended loans worth Rs 61,000 crore to women's groups and was bearing the interest burden to prevent women from depending on microfinance institutions. She said nearly six lakh women had already availed loans under various schemes and added that the government was implementing accident insurance and loan insurance programmes to provide financial security to women.

Highlighting the achievements of women's groups, Seethakka said 553 buses had recently been handed over to women's groups and that they were earning an average monthly income of around Rs 70,000 through their operations. She also noted that women's groups

earned Rs 159 crore during procurement operations in the previous crop season.

The Minister said women were excelling in sectors such as tailoring, jewellery making and event management and urged them to establish self-employment centres and shops. She further said interest-free loans ranging from Rs 5 lakh to Rs 10 lakh were being provided and added that the government was taking measures to ensure employment opportunities for everyone with tailoring skills in both rural and urban areas.

Seethakka said one lakh women had already been enrolled in "Sneha" groups and trained in bicycle riding, while plans were underway to provide them with electric bikes in future. She also pointed out that 106 shops at Shilparamam were being successfully run by women.

Telangana case behind the trouble for Meenakshi Natarajan's nomination

Hyderabad, June 10 (GNS) A huge row erupted over Congress leader Meenakshi Natarajan's nomination for Rajya Sabha in Madhya Pradesh. The focus is on the case allegedly pending in a court in Hyderabad, which was not mentioned in her affidavit. The legal notice sent to the AICC in-charge for Telangana at the state Congress office, Gandhi Bhavan, last year shows that she was one of the respondents in a private complaint filed by a former Congress leader and a former corporator of Greater Hyderabad Municipal Corporation (GHMC).

The complaint was filed under section 223 of BNSS in the Court of the 4th Additional Chief Judicial Mag-



istrate at Hyderabad in 2025. Meenakshi Natarajan, listed as the fourth respondent, was directed to appear in the court on September 17, 2025, and file a counter, if any.

Srilatha, who was a corporator elected on the TDP ticket from 2002 to 2007, had filed the petition in court against a Congress leader,

Shiva Kumar Reddy, alleging that she faces a threat to her life from him and his supporters. The complainant named seven Congress leaders, including Meenakshi Natarajan, as respondents on the ground that they were apprised of the 'harassment' and 'threats' but had failed to act against the said person.

Following the court's direction on the complaint, an FIR was registered on May 28, 2025. Sources in Congress say that Natarajan was not named in the first police complaint filed by Srilatha in 2022. The case was then disposed of due to a lack of evidence. Her later private complaints in Hyderabad and Bengaluru, too, were disposed of.

The returning officer in Madhya Pradesh, who rejected Natarajan's nomination, reportedly acted on a complaint by senior BJP leader and Minister in the Mohan Yadav government, Kailash Vijayargiya. The complaint contended that a case involving Natarajan is pending before a Telangana

court and was not disclosed in her nomination affidavit.

Kailash Vijayargiya's remark suggesting that they received the 'paper' from a Congress leader in Telangana sparked a row. Bharat Rashtra Samithi (BRS) leaders were quick to point fingers at Chief Minister A. Revanth Reddy, who also holds the home portfolio.

"Who informed Madhya Pradesh BJP? Is there a role of Home Minister of Telangana?" asked BRS leader Krishank Manne.

The BRS leader claims that Natarajan opposed the Musi River beautification project, the demolitions of houses in Khammam, and deforestation at the University of Hyderabad.

DFI Depositors Asked to Submit Details

Hyderabad, June 10 (GNS) Hyderabad City Police have appealed to all depositors of Dhanwantari Foundation International (DFI), who have not yet submitted their investment details to the Central Crime Station (CCS), to do so at the earliest to facilitate the recovery and distribution process.

Based on a complaint lodged by Susrala Narsimha Murthy, a case was registered at CCS, Hyderabad, on December 23, 2023, against the foundation under Sections 406 and 420 read with 34 of the IPC and Section 5 of the Telangana

Protection of Depositors of Financial Establishments (TGPDFE) Act, police said in a release on Wednesday.

Investigations revealed that Dhanwantari Foundation International Trust, represented by its director Dr. P. Kamalakar Sharma and others, allegedly lured senior citizens and members of the Brahmin community by promising attractive returns on deposits within a specified period. The organisation is accused of collecting nearly Rs 516 crore from more than 2,000 investors and subsequently cheating them.

Rajnath Singh to review Combined Graduation Parade at Air Force Academy on June 13

Hyderabad, June 10 (GNS) Defence Minister Rajnath Singh will review the Combined Graduation Parade (CGP) of the 217 Course at the Air Force Academy (AFA), Dundigal, near Hyderabad, on June 13.

The parade will mark the successful completion of pre-commissioning training of Flight Cadets from various branches of the Indian Air Force (IAF). During the ceremony, the Defence Minister, as the Reviewing Officer, will confer the President's Commission on the graduating trainees.

The event will also witness the presentation of

"Wings" and "Brevets" to Flight Cadets of the IAF, officers and trainees of the Indian Navy, Indian Coast Guard and the Socialist Republic of Vietnam upon successful completion of training. Significantly, the CGP will mark the commissioning of the first batch of women cadets from the National Defence Academy (NDA), Pune, who passed out on May 30, 2025, and subsequently underwent branch-specific training at the Air Force Academy.

The Defence Minister will also present the President's Plaque to Flight Cadets securing first position

in the overall order of merit in Flying, Navigation and Ground Duty branches.

The ceremony will feature performances by the Akash Ganga skydiving team and the Air Warrior Drill Team (AWDT). Flypasts led by Chief of the Air Staff Air Chief Marshal A.P. Singh will showcase trainer aircraft including the Pilatus PC-7 MkII, Hawk, Kiran and Chetak aircraft. Aerial displays by the SU-30 MKI fighter aircraft, Sarang helicopter display team and the Suryakiran Aerobatic Team (SKAT) are expected to be major attractions of the event.

Modi Govt driven by development & public welfare: Ramchander Rao

Hyderabad, June 10 (GNS) Telangana BJP State President N Ramchander Rao on Wednesday said the Narendra Modi-led NDA government had transformed the country over the last 12 years with a strong focus on development, public welfare, infrastructure growth and economic reforms.

Addressing a press conference here to mark 12 years of the Modi government, Rao described Prime Minister Narendra Modi's tenure as a "golden era" in India's democratic history and said the Centre had worked with the objectives of "Jan Vishwas, Vikas and Jan Kalyan" (People's Trust, Development and Public Welfare).

He said Modi had be-



come the longest-serving consecutively elected Prime Minister in the country after completing 4,399 days in office and credited the achievement to the trust and aspirations of 140 crore Indians.

The BJP leader alleged that corruption and scams had marked the earlier UPA regime, while the Modi government focused on re-

forms and freeing the country from a colonial mindset through measures such as replacing the IPC and CrPC with new criminal laws and introducing the National Education Policy. Highlighting achievements of the NDA government, Rao said infrastructure spending had increased from around Rs 2 lakh crore before 2014 to Rs 12.2 lakh crore at present, while GST collections crossed Rs 22 lakh crore during 2024-25.

He said India's Ease of Doing Business ranking improved from 142 to 63 and added that digital connectivity had expanded across the country through BharatNet and digital literacy programmes.

Rao stated that over Rs 50 lakh crore had been transferred directly to beneficiaries through the JAM and DBT systems without middlemen.
